## SOCIAL SECURITY

Employees of nonprofit organizations may become entitled to Federal old-age and survivors insurance protection under the 1950 amendments to the Social Security Act. The definition of "nonprofit organizations" for social security purposes is taken from the Federal Income tax laws, which describe one group of such organizations as:

"Corporations, and any community chest, fund, or foundation, organized and operated exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary or educational purposes, or for the prevention of cruelty to children or animals, no part of the net earnings of which inures to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual, and no substantial part of the activities of which is carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation."

The organization must agree to assume the employer's share of the social security tax on its employee's wages. It does this by filing a certificate of waiver from tax exemption with the Bureau of Internal Revenue. Another condition is that at least two-thirds of the employees of the organization eligible for coverage indicate in writing their desire to participate in social security. If these two conditions are met, those workers who signed would come under social security, but not the employees who did not sign. However, any employees hired by

Just a few lines to your paper which we appreciate each week. We know so many people in Prince William that we would like to write but our time is scarce, for we are always busy with our trailer park and our citrus grove.

It is cooler than usual for this time of year in Florida because of the cold waves up North, but the organization after the calendar quarter in which the certificate is filed would have this protection.

Even if a nonprofit organization meets these conditions, certain kinds of work are excluded from social security, for instance, work done by members of the clergy in the exercise of their ministry, or by members of religious orders in the exercise of the duties by such orders.

The agreements are not necessary for certain other nonprofit organizations whose employees are covered by the social security law if they earn \$50 or more in a calendar quarter. Among these are many agricultural and labor groups and voluntary employees beneficiary organizations, both private and Federal. Building and loan associations, mutual savings and cooperative banks are included, also fraternal beneficiary societies, business and civic leagues, chambers of commerce, real estate boards, and boards of trade, social clubs, civic and recreational associations.

workers in this county include Mrs. Leona Barlow, Home Demonstration Agent, Miss Eva Cobb, Assistant Home Demonstration Agent in Training who will be with us until the first of the year, Mr. Frank Cox, County Agricultural Agent, and I, as Assistant County Agricultural Agent. Our duties are to bring information from the Experiment Stations to farm people in a way they can best use it to improve their standards of living. This is done largely through demonstrations, 4-H clubs, farmer's groups, home demonstration clubs as well as many personal visits and contacts. The program is of an educational nature.

In two high schools in the county there are Vocational Agricultural Departments and Home Economics Departments in three of the county schools. The instructor of Vocational Agriculture at Nokesville is P. B. Reading and the Home Economics Instructor is Elmore Morgan. In Manassas the Vocational Instructor is R. R. The Veterans Instructor at Nokesville is Harry O. Swann whose job is to conduct the On-The-Farm Training Program and he also handles classroom instruction to the veterans.

**CHRISTMAS SALADS**  
Are you racking your brain for a pretty Christmas salad? Something that will give that final touch to your Christmas Dinner? Salads lend themselves to so much individuality and can be made from such unusual concoctions. This one is so easy to make and gives just the necessary twang that goes well with turkey and fruitcake. It may also be made into a mold by adding softened gelatin:  
**CRANBERRY ORANGE RELISH**  
Put 4 c. cranberries  
2 oranges, quartered and seeded  
2 c. sugar  
Put raw cranberries and oranges through food chopper. Add sugar

and mix well. Chill in refrigerator a few hours before serving. Makes one quart relish. This relish will keep well in the refrigerator for several weeks.

**FRUITED CHEESE RING**  
2 tablespoons gelatin  
2 tablespoons cold water  
1 c. hot milk  
2 3-ounce packages Philadelphia Cream Cheese  
3 tablespoons Bleu cheese  
1/2 c. mayonnaise  
1 tablespoon French dressing  
1/4 c. chopped pecans  
Soak gelatin in cold water, dissolve in cold water, dissolve in hot milk. Blend cream cheese and Bleu. Add milk, beating until mixture is smooth. Fold in mayonnaise, French Dressing, and chopped pecans. Pack into 8-inch mold. Chill until firm.

When ready to serve, loosen around edges of mold by dipping into hot water. Invert ring on a glass plate on which lettuce leaves have been placed. Put 6 or 8 maraschino cherries around mold and fill center with a mixture of pink grapefruit and orange wedges (cut in two several times), and thin slices from a very red apple. Surround the mold with the same mixture, using apples, grapefruit and orange wedges alternately, but a pretty bunch of parsley in center. Serve with French Dressing.

**RIBBON ASPIC SALAD**  
Tomato Aspic and Cheese Layers  
Soften 1 envelope plain gelatin in 1 c. tomato juice 5 minutes. Heat 1 c. additional tomato juice; season to taste. Add gelatin, stirring until completely dissolved. Chill in refrigerator until mixture begins to thicken. Line a loaf pan about 9"x5" w/ waxed paper for easy removal of loaf. Carefully pour tomato aspic into paper lined loaf pan or dish. Season 1 c. cottage cheese to taste with Worcestershire sauce, tabasco sauce and salt. Now spread cheese on a sheet of waxed paper in an even layer the length and width of the mold. Turn paper upside-down over mold, placing cheese layer on aspic. "Peel off" paper and spread cheese into corners with spatula.

**Perfection Salad Layer**  
(Prepare while tomato layer is chilling)  
1 envelope lime gelatin  
1/4 c. lemon juice  
1/4 cbl. sugar  
1 1/2 c. hot water  
1/4 c. raw green pepper, (finely chopped)  
1/4 c. raw cabbage, finely chopped  
1/4 c. raw carrot, finely chopped  
Green coloring may be added.  
Soften gelatin in lemon juice for 5 min. Add sugar and hot water; stir until gelatin is thoroughly dissolved. Add chopped pepper, cabbage and carrots to gelatin mixture. Chill until thickened. Pour over cheese layer. Allow to set until very firm. Unmold. Shape star in center with cream cheese. Make a border using sliced stuffed olives.

Keeping your Christmas tree in water is still the best method of "fire-proofing."  
J. W. O'Byrne, forester at V.P.I., says if the tree is kept in water it will remain as fresh as a tree can be, and there will be fewer falling needles.  
However, all trees will dry out to some extent when cut. Select the tree you want, but let it stand

uncut until a short time before Christmas.

O'Byrne suggests this method of setting up a Christmas tree:

Get a broad bottom pail (a five gallon paint pail is excellent), or a small tub. Put a few inches of sand in the bottom. Cut off the base of the tree, preferably on a slight slope so there will be fresh wood to take up the water. Stand the tree in the sand and fill the rest of the pail with stones. The stones will support the tree. Keep the sand saturated with water. Set the tree as far from your source of heat as possible.

O'Byrne also warns against loose cotton for "snow" around the base of the tree. If you must have something white around the tree, use a sheet. It will burn, but not like loose cotton.

Other "don'ts":  
Don't use candles. If electricity is not available, it is better to do without lights.

Don't give toys which involve the use of fire, or encourage the use of matches.
