VOTE MONEY FOR HOME PROJECTS

Supervisors Approprate \$600 for Home Demonstration Work—Other Business.

An appropriation of \$600 toward the annual salary of the county home demonstration agent and a shortening of the hunting season, which opens November 1, to January 1 instead of February 1 featured the regular meeting of the county board of supervisors, which was in all-day session at the courthouse on Tuesday.

Supervisor J. L. Dawson, of Occoquan district, presided over the meeting and the other members in attendance were Supervisors McDuff Green, Brentsville district; A. S. Robertson, Manassas district; T. M. Russell, Coles district, and William Crow, Dumfries district. Supervisor O. C. Hutcheson, of Gainesville district, was absent.

Treasurer ordered to credit \$768.32 to county fund from permanent road fund, to reimburse county fund for amount advanced to G. M. Ratcliffe, paymaster.

William Crow authorized to purchase 1000 feet of oak plank for bridge over Quantico creek near Robert A. Taylor's.

Treasurer ordered to credit to county fund \$2,467.56, charged to said fund as of Feb. 24, 1920.

Appropriation of \$600 per annum for salary of Lillian V. Gilbert as county home demonstration agent.

Hunting season for Prince William county changed from November 1-February 1 to November 1-January 1. Warrant of April 27, \$12.25, payable to A. J. Miller, cancelled and warrant in same sum drawn to Mary Miller.

The following accounts were examined, approved and certified to the treasurer for payment:

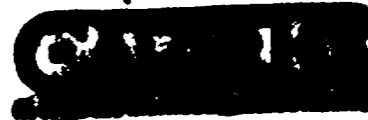
