SPLendid EXHIBITS AT FARMERS' INSTITUTE

CORN SHOW ATTRACTIVE FEATURE

Display Products of Field and Home - Young Women Win Prizes for Cookery - Awards on Corn Exhibits.

ENTHUSIASTIC SESSION
Enthusiasm was the keynote of the initial session of the Farmers' Institute for the season and the introductory Corn Show. From this most auspicious beginning it is believed that an Agricultural Fair will develop. At any rate the educational value of an exposition was never more fully demonstrated than at this Institute and Corn Show.

Competition between exhibitors created lively interest, and was productive of much benefit. The interchange of ideas on modern methods of farming, and comparison of experiments constitute in large measure the utility of such enterprises. In this era of efficiency the soil as well as the individual is made to produce its utmost. But the productivity of the soil is measured by the capability of the man who tills it.

The Farmers' Institute and Corn Show adds immensely to the community wealth.

The Farmers' Institute and Corn Show held in the Court House and Ruffner School Building on Friday, November 18, proved one of the most instructive and enjoyable meetings that has been held. About 600 ears of corn and 30 plates of apples and potatoes were exhibited by the farmers and students, while Domestic Science class showed an appetizing display of 15 layer cakes, and some 20 samples of bread and biscuit, besides aprons that evidenced needle-work of a high order.

FINE EXHIBITS
The library of Ruffner School was filled to overflowing with products of the skill and patience of the Prince William county farmers and pupils. Not only were the exhibits numerous, but the quality was exceptionally fine. Many exhibits worthy of more than passing notice, were unavoidably overlooked in the distribution of prizes.

AWARD PRIZES

The first prize for ten ears of corn raised by a boy in the Corn Club went to Roswell Round, of Manassas. Frank Roraubach, of Bradley, took second with a uniform and symmetrical sample of Boone county white. As some of the boys have not sold their corn, the prizes for largest yield, best profit and best written account of raising have not yet been awarded.

The class for ten ears selected by any school boy from any corn crop, brought out a large number of excellent exhibits. The first prize was awarded to Herman Steele, the second to Percy Raymond and the third to Burr Button.

The corn scoring contest for public school boys was won by Alfred Prescott with Howard Holmes and Clark Johnson tied for second, and Raymond Florence highly commended.

The corn judging by High School boys was still more difficult to decide, as six of the papers were within three points of perfect. The first prize was given Paul Rexrode, second to Herman Steele, and on third George Adanson. Earl Merrill, Carroll Rice and Roger Elgin were about equal.

The classes for farmers were all filled with creditable exhibits. In the class for white corn for seed land, W. E. Heuser, of Haymarket, won both first and second prizes, and sweepstakes for the best ear on some of his own.

FRIGHTFUL INJURIES FROM KICK BY HORSE

VICTIM, M. SEESE, NOKESVILLE

Nose and Left Cheek Bone Broken - Flesh Ground to Pulp - Taken to Washington for Operation.

Mahlon Seese, of Nokesville, is, battling death in Emergency Hospital, Washington, as a result of fearful injuries sustained by a kick in the face from a horse late Tuesday afternoon in Nokesville. The left cheek bone and his nose were broken and the flesh of his face mashed to pulp where struck by the hoof. That he escaped being killed outright is attributed to the horse being mistook. After the accident Mr. Seese was taken to Washington for an operation, by Dr. Benjamin Brown, who was summoned.

During the day Mr. Seese had been sawing wood for S. H. Hinegardner, in Nokesville. He had finished his work, and was watering his team before hitching them to a wagon for the drive home, about a mile from town. One horse kicked at the other and missed its aim, but dealt Mr. Seese a terrific blow in the face, inflicting injuries that may prove fatal, although he was in no immediate danger at a late hour yesterday. It is believed that he has a fighting chance for recovery unless complications set in. Mr. Seese has a wife and five sons.

OPERATE PLANT BY DECEMBER 1

Running Water and Better Fire Protection for Ruffner and Bennett Buildings - Erect New Storage Tank.

A water system adequate to supply the Bennett and Ruffner school buildings with running water and afford better fire protection is being installed on the Bennett grounds and will be in operation December 1. A well recently drilled there gives an abundant supply of good water. A storage tank of 2,000 gallons capacity is being erected. The water is to be pumped by a gasoline engine.

INVESTORS SEEK TOWN PROPERTY

Gala Day Atmosphere Prevails at Auction Sale of Lots - Buyers Come in from All Sections of County.

Nokesville yesterday was the scene of one of the greatest home-building movements inaugurated in the progressive town, when choice lots in the property owned by W. R. Free, Jr., near the depot and close by Hebron Seminary were sold to investors at auction.

Hundreds of visitors came in from all sections of the county, the streets were crowded with people and lined with teams, the band was playing from morning until night and a gala day atmosphere prevailed.

The sale began in the morning at 10 o'clock and continued until late in the afternoon. Many valuable souvenirs were given away as mementoes of the occasion. It is believed that the enterprise will result in a new era of building activity for the town.

FLAMES LAY IN RUINS NEW HOME AND OLD

DESTRUCTIVE BLAZE AT ORLANDO

Blaze in Log House Communicates With New Residence on Breeden Property - Loss \$1,800 - No Insurance.

Powerless to check the destruction, Mr. and Mrs. William A. Breeden last Thursday saw flames destroy the log house that for many years had been the family home at Orlando, and then burn down their new residence just completed and representing long saving. The loss is estimated at \$1,800. There was no insurance.

BURN TO GROUND

A sheet of flame burst through the wall of the log house, crept over a connecting roof and set fire to the new residence. Not until both buildings were ablaze

was the family aware of peril, and then the flames had spread beyond control. By great effort they saved a few household ef-

fects, and then driven back by the flames they saw the buildings burn to the ground.

DEFECTIVE FLUE CAUSE

The cause of the fire is assigned to a defective flue in the log house, a landmark in that section of the county. The family had planned to occupy the new residence this week, and retain the log house for culinary purposes. Neighbors had suggested that the old log house be removed, declaring that its immediate proximity detracted from the beauty of the new building. But Mr. and Mrs. Breeden treasured the associations of the log house, the old family home, and would not consider its removal. Neighbors are subscribing funds to reimburse the family for its loss, lists being circulated by Mr. and Mrs. W. P. Brown and others.

CLIFTON BAPTISTS LAY EDIFICE CORNERSTONE

STRUCTURE WILL COST \$4,000

Ceremonies This Morning Under Auspices of Masonic Fraternity - Many Visitors to Witness Event.

Thanksgiving in its highest significance will characterize the scene when, with impressive Masonic rites, the cornerstone of the new Baptist church edifice in Clifton, is laid this morning at 11 o'clock. The ceremonies will be enacted by Acacia Lodge No. 16, A. F. & A. M., of Clifton, assisted by members of the Masonic fraternity from Manassas, Haymarket, Occoquan and Fairfax. Past Grand Master F. L. Allen, of Alexandria, has been extended an invitation to take part in the ceremonies. The visiting Masons will be entertained at the Hotel Clifton.

"A Sure Foundation," is the theme, most appropriate to the occasion, of a sermon to be delivered by the pastor, the Rev. T. D. D. Clarke, in the present edifice this afternoon at 2 o'clock. Union Thanksgiving services will be held there this evening, the Rev. W. H. Edwards, pastor of the Presbyterian Church, officiating.

EDIFICE TO COST \$4,000

The new edifice of the Baptist Church at Clifton is to be erected at a cost of approximately \$4,000. The structure will be built of frame, and will be 45 feet long and 35 feet wide, with a seating capacity of 300 persons. The floor will incline, giving an unobstructed view of the pulpit. The building will be modern, and heated by furnace.

Down in Richmond this week essays written by children in the rural schools of Prince William county are to be entered in competition with compositions by other tots from all over Virginia for a state prize, the latest edition of a standard dictionary, offered by the Virginia Educational Conference. Many essays for distinction of entry into state competition were submitted to a committee of the Prince William County Teachers' Association. All of them were excellent, but, of course, only the very best were chosen. They were subjected to the most rigid kind of a test so there is no doubt of their literary quality. The contest was instituted to stimulate general interest in English composition.

EXCELLENT ESSAYS

The sessions of the Educational Conference opened Tuesday morning and will close tomorrow night. The essays by children of Prince William county rural schools will be presented by Mrs. M. S. Moffett, president of the Rural Teachers' Conference and member of the executive committee of the State Teachers' Association. Mrs. Moffett will conduct a department of normal training. The state course in normal training is based upon a curriculum outlined by her.

PRINCE WILLIAM REPRESENTED

Prof. E. S. Edmonds, principal of the Haymarket schools, is the official delegate of the Prince William County Teachers' Association. George C. Round, of the Manassas school board, will discuss "A Suggested Course for the Agricultural High School," and will also discuss "The Future Policy of the State of Virginia as to the Teaching of Agriculture in the Public Schools." Prof. H. F. Button, director of the Manassas Agricultural High School, will discuss "Agricultural Extension Work; the Relation of the School to the Community." He will give an address on "College Entrance Credit for High School Agriculture," and also an address on "Agriculture for Rural Schools."

In departmental work, the Manassas public schools are represented with discussions on "Bird Clubs; the Protection of Our Birds," by Miss A. Taylor, and "Reading and Work," by Miss Stella George G. The Road Law

Upon the return of said process duly executed, defense may be made to the said proceedings by any person who has the right of supervising or may hear testimony touching the expediency or propriety of establishing or altering the road or landing.

But if any tenant or proprietor desires it, or if the board of supervisors see cause for doing it, shall appoint five disinterested resident freeholders of the county as commissioners (any three of whom may act) for the purpose of ascertaining a just compensation for the land to be used for road or landing.

If such applicant, proprietor or tenant, is dissatisfied with the decision of the board of supervisors in respect to the opening or location of the proposed road or the amount of compensation allowed, he may of right appeal to the circuit court of said county, and the said court shall hear the matter de novo, with the further right to appeal as provided by general law.
