

MAINE HOTEL BURNS WHILE GUESTS SLEEP

INSURANCE COVERS LOSS OF \$2,000

Defective Flue Causes Flaming Chimney Entire Upper Rear Part of Building Lucky Escape from Death.

With the roof burning over them while they slept, occupants of the Maine Hotel were awakened by falling plastering when flames burst into their rooms at daybreak Monday morning, and that they escaped death or injury appears providential.

The damage on the first floor was heaviest in the kitchen and immediate communicating rooms. A part of the equipment was saved.

The loss on the building owned by Mrs. Anna Davis is \$1,500, insured in companies represented by Thos. H. Lion.

The fire was discovered by Jerry Cantrell, father-in-law of Carl Traeger, lessor of the hotel. He had arisen to light the kitchen stove, and while sitting on the porch was startled by flames issuing from the building.

The Maine hotel, one of the landmarks of the town, was built about twenty years ago. It has been conducted as a hotel by Carl Traeger for about a year.

DEATH OF JARFIELD ARTHUR DODGE

Tuesday morning, Postmaster H. P. Dodge received a telegram announcing the death of his son, Jarfield Arthur Dodge at Denver, Colorado.

He was in the 32nd year of his age, having been born at Unionville, Ohio, September 9, 1879.

He was reared at Manassas, Va., and received his preparatory education at the Manassas Institute, conducted at that time by the Misses Osborne.

In 1897 he entered the sophomore class at the College of William and Mary at Williamsburg, spending three years in the collegiate and one year in the post-graduate courses at the institution, graduating with the degrees of A. B. and A. M.

He then entered John Hopkins University, at Baltimore, Md., where he made a special study of the languages of Latin, Greek and Sanscrit, graduating from the University with the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in 1905.

That fall, he accepted the Chair of Greek in King's College, Bristol, Tenn. He was stricken with tuberculosis in December of that year, since then he has made a heroic but vain fight for the regaining of his health at various sanitariums and health resorts.

Dr. Dodge was a member of the Manassas Presbyterian Church.

The remains will be sent home for burial in the Manassas cemetery beside those of his brother, Robert Percival Dodge, who died five years ago last June.

The funeral will be held from the Presbyterian Church next Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Dr. H. G. Roop officiating. Interment will be in Manassas cemetery.

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PEACE JUBILEE GREAT SUCCESS

PRESIDENT TALKS WORLD PEACE

Fiftieth Anniversary of Battle of Bull Run Celebrated - Blue and Gray Clasp Hands Across the 'Bloody Chasm.'

In the presence of thousands of people the reunion and peace jubilee took place on historic Bull Run plains from 9 to 5 p. m. Gov. Mann, accompanied by his staff and escorted by the Front Royal Guards, arrived on the grounds shortly before noon and was chief orator of the occasion.

Among the collection, which numbered about 500 articles, the following deserve special mention: Pieces of old china from China brought to America on the historic battleship 'Constitution' loaned by Mrs. A. L. Henry.

The President referred with feeling to the loss of life and suffering during the civil war, and declared he deplored armed strife and wished it could be abolished.

Therefore I look to you, veterans of the civil war, to aid in the movement for peace. I am glad to announce here today that as England has agreed to enter into an arbitration treaty with the United States, France has signified her willingness to enter into the same treaty.

I have received at least a thousand letters and postals in response to the call for the jubilee. With one single exception on each side, all are in perfect accord with the spirit of the jubilee.

These two special to the Washington Post seem to be the only files in the pot of ointment. I have communicated my denial of the main fact stated in the Washington Post, but that paper has so far failed to give that denial a place in its columns.

The President was introduced by Gov. Mann. When the crowd had stopped cheering the President laughingly glanced down on his battered dress, and said: 'It is a great pleasure for me to be here today. We ordinarily do not enjoy those things we get without effort - and it has been some effort for me to get here today.'

The President concluded with a tribute to the sentiment which inspired the reunion. Then, standing beside the great speaker of Virginia, he posed for the photographers.

The President's address, which was brief, dealt mainly on the good to be accomplished by this Virginia road.

The Manassas Horse Show was a pronounced success. The weather was all that could be wished and brought a crowd of over 2,700 on the first day - the largest for ten years.

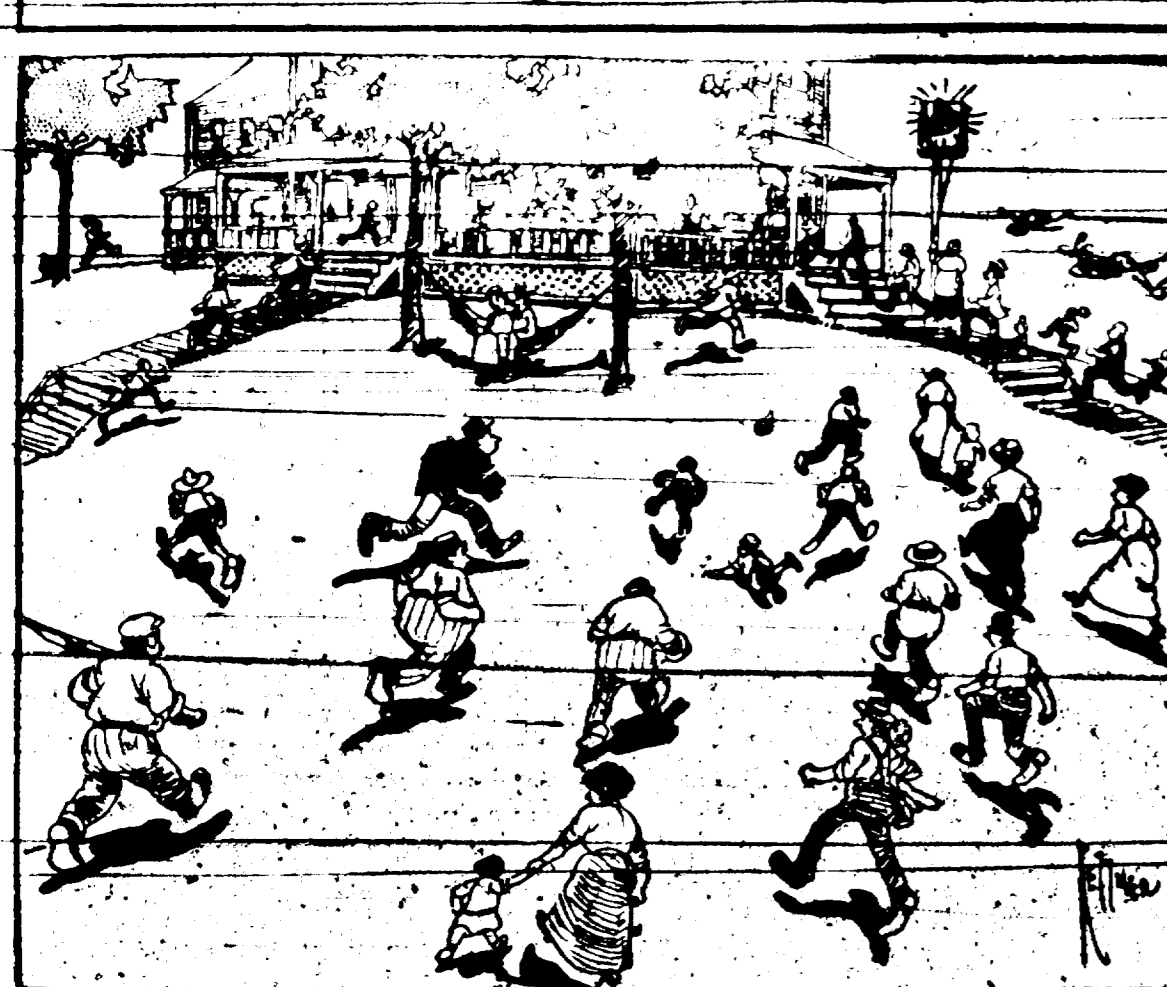
MEETING OF BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

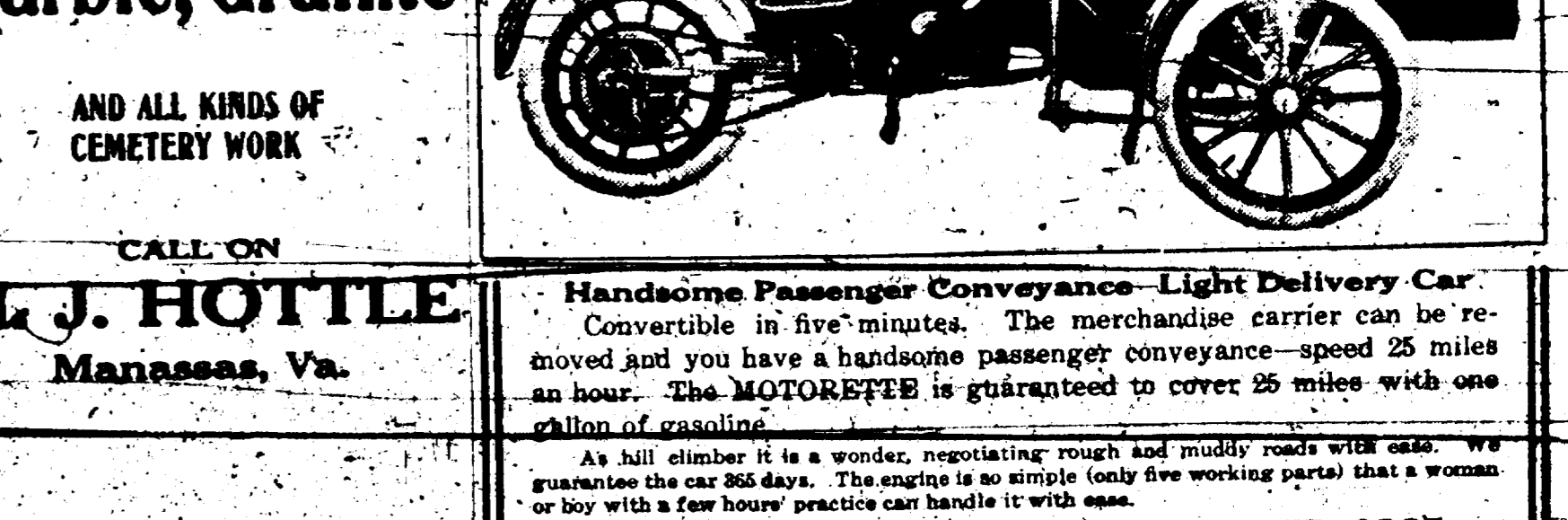
