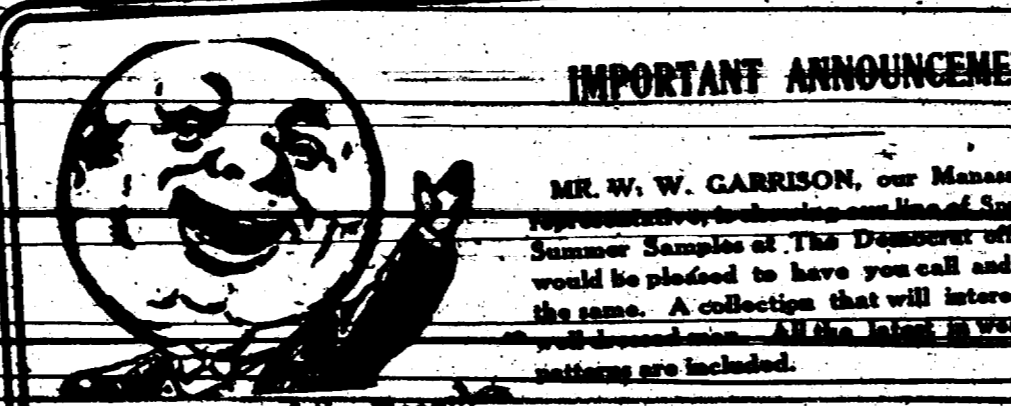

NEMESIS FOLLOWS THE FAIR FAMILY

STRANGE CHAIN OF FATALITIES
The last link in the family tragedy, which has puzzled the fair family of this county for many years, was the death of Mrs. Padgett, who was shot and killed by her daughter-in-law, Mrs. Padgett, on Monday morning of last week, recalls a strange fatality which has puzzled the fair family of this county for many years.

Padgett is a grand-daughter of the late Charles Fair, of near Token, and a daughter of Silas Putnam, who shot and killed his wife and then turned the gun upon himself with fatal effect in his home in Falls Church, about four years ago. The Padgett-Souder tragedy was the result of a quarrel over the bringing of Mrs. Padgett's little ten-year-old brother from his home in Falls Church to his sister's home in Washington. When the body of Mrs. Putnam was brought to the home of her youth in this county for burial, her sister, Chas. Fair, was so overcome with grief that he fell, a corpse, at his daughter's grave.

When Chas. Fair was a young man he was engaged to marry a Miss Payne of this county, but the couple quarreled, and the engagement was broken, and the young lady moved to Pennsylvania. Mr. Fair, shortly thereafter, married Miss Posey, some of the man charged with his son, Edward Fair's murder, near Token, one year subsequent to the Putnam tragedy.

Shortly after Chas. Fair's marriage to Miss Posey, he met his former sweetheart, Miss Payne, in the depot in Washington and informed her of his recent marriage. The shock to his former fiancée, who was on her way to Prince William county to effect a reconciliation with her former lover, was so great as to cause her instant death. Then followed the death of Chas. Fair's two sons, Edward and Allen, it being claimed that their sister, Mrs. Minnie Posey assisted in the fearful and shocking tragedy.

The last link in the chain of the strange fatality came when Harrison Beavers, a relative of the Beavers, suffered a broken leg by the fall of a tree, and which prevented him a material witness from testifying in the Posey murder trial—the most revolting tragedy that ever occurred in Prince William county, especially from the fact that the parties to the crime were of the same flesh and blood.

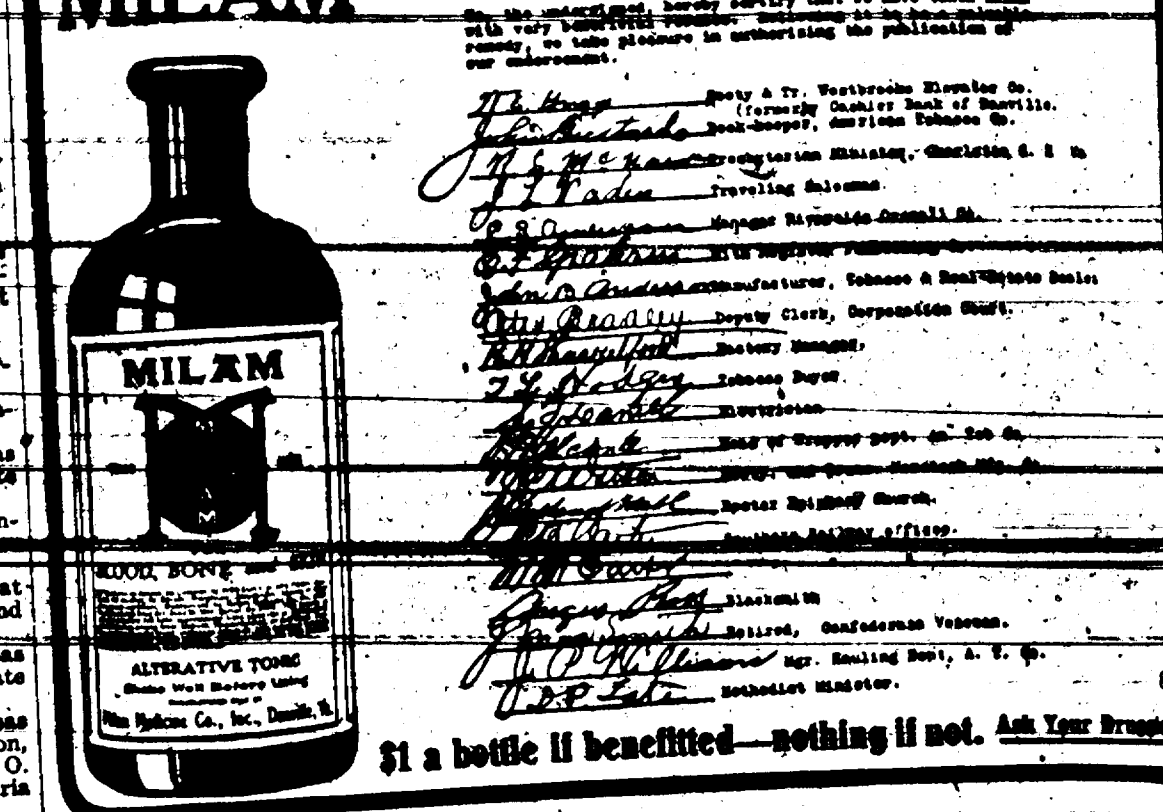

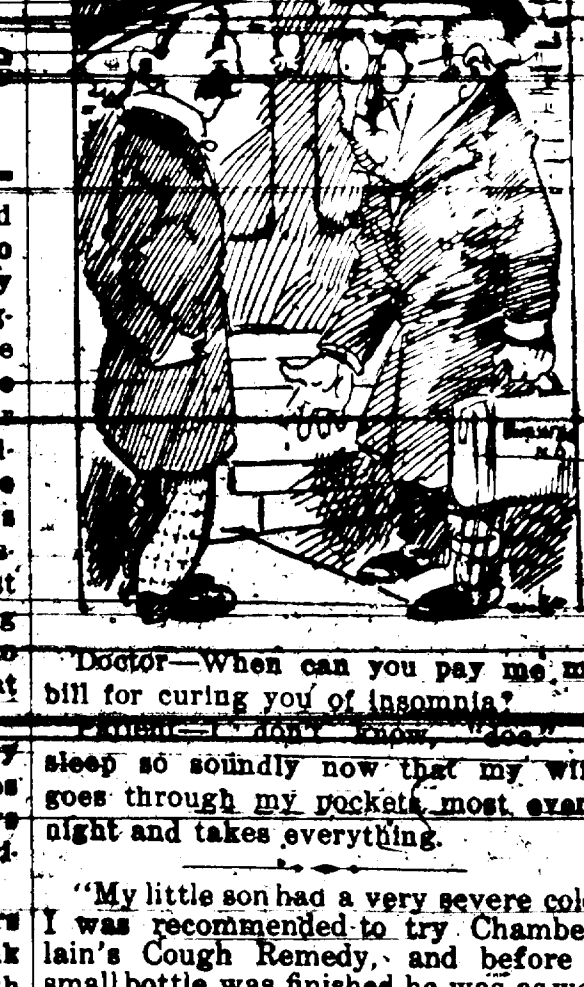

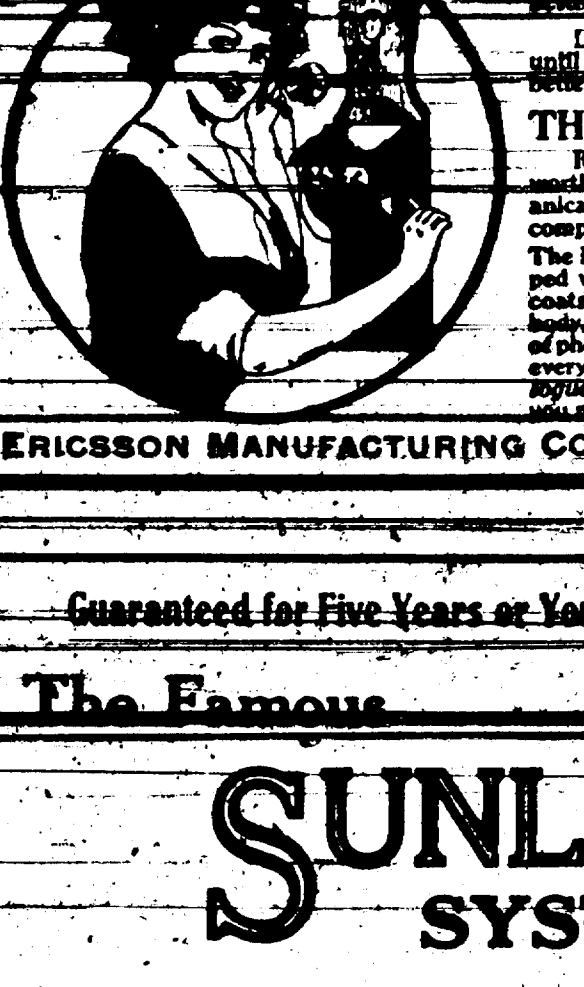
