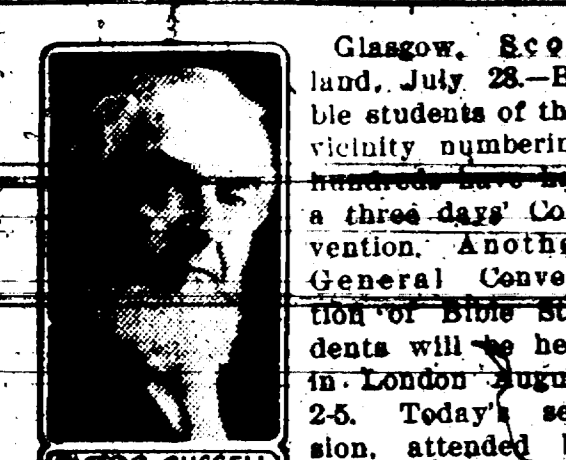

REST-OF THE DEAD LIVED NOT AGAIN

The General Resurrection and the First Resurrection

Pastor Russell's Address at the International Bible Students Convention in Scotland—Several Thousand Hear Explained Much Misunderstood Text



Classroom, July 28—Bible students of this vicinity numbering about three days' Convention. Another general convention of the same kind was held in London August 25. Today's session, attended by several hundred students, was addressed by Pastor Russell. We report one of his addresses based on Revelation 20:11-15.

Christianity Versus Platonism. Many Christians whose faith can't accept the Divine promise advanced long before Jesus' day by the Greek philosophers, headed by Plato. Their teachings respecting death, though less logical than the Bible, require less faith. Thus, they say, the Christian faith is respecting the future life is supported by the Bible. The teachings of the heathen from Plato down to Aristotle and the heathen claim without evidence that dying was not the penalty for sin, that on the contrary it was the step of ascension to a new life, a passage-way to a new life, the resurrection of the dead.

Then the Bible declares that from the very beginning God purposed the resurrection of the dead and that, therefore, all believers were privileged to spend their lives in waiting for the resurrection. The Bible tells us that "Abraham slept with his fathers" and that he had been alive in heaven for centuries.

First or Chief Resurrection. Not all of the dead will have the same resurrection. Some will be raised in the first resurrection, while others, members of the Body of Christ, will be granted a superior resurrection to glory, honor, immortality and the divine nature of the Father.
