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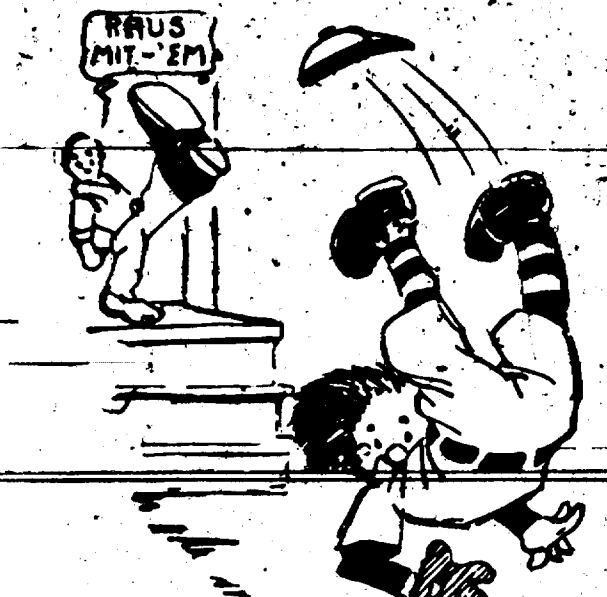

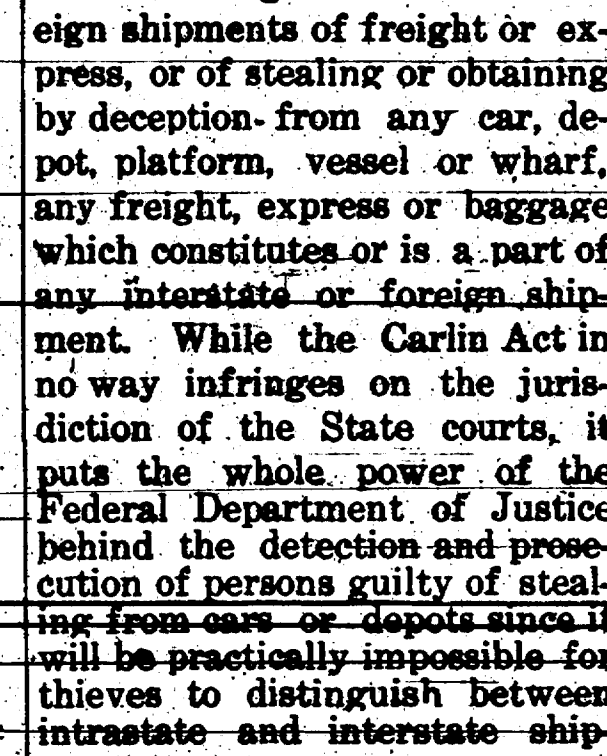
Cather Threw Glasscock Out at Home.

The Alexander Water Co. has awarded a contract for the construction of the largest dam and reservoir in Northern Virginia. It will be built across Holmes Run, near Barcroft, Fairfax county, and the structure will be of concrete 600 feet long, 50 feet thick at the base and 70 feet in height. The reservoir thus formed will cover 76 acres, will be 6 1/2 miles in circumference and will hold 600,000,000 gallons of water. The total cost will exceed \$250,000.

INCREASE SHOWN IN PENSION ROLL

At last, and for the first time since Virginia began to pay pensions to her veterans of the War between the States, the amount needed to pay the pension roll has begun to decrease. The books of the office of the Auditor of Public Accounts show that while \$490,000 was paid out for pensions during the year ending March 1, 1912, there was a reduction to \$468,000 in the period ending March 1 of this year. The result is that the pension fund has just paid back into the general treasury the sum of \$24,000 of the \$500,000 appropriated by the legislature at its last session.

The General Assembly of 1910 set apart \$400,000 for this purpose for the succeeding two years. The approved pension claims of September, 1911, showed so clearly that the appropriation would be insufficient that the Auditor was obliged to deduct 10 per cent from each check that year. This was restored by the Legislature of 1912, which promptly upon its meeting passed a bill making a special appropriation of \$40,000 to pay off the veterans who lost the 10 per cent and the money was sent out at once. To prevent the recurrence of such a condition, the Legislature set aside \$500,000 a year for the next two years for pensions.

The total of names on the roll shows little decrease, but the pensioners under the act of 1888, made up of those who had a limb or were totally incapacitated through wounds or disease received in the war, are paying rapidly, and, as they draw the larger sums, the reduction in the total will now be rather sharp.

It will be possible in the future for the State, by keeping up the same total appropriations, to largely increase from year to year the checks sent to surviving veterans and widows.

VIRGINIA WAR CLAIMS \$235,771

The Sims War Claims Bill, which Congressman Sims has introduced in the House, carries \$235,771 to pay claims held by Virginia citizens and churches against the Government on account of damages done by the Union soldiers during the Civil War. The amount allowed Virginia is the largest of any of the Southern States, due mainly to the fact that the Old Dominion was the battle ground of the war between the States.

The bulk of the Virginia claims are presented by churches in that State. Ten churches in Culpeper county ask for \$10,330. The churches around Fredericksburg have put in claims aggregating \$43,000 and the churches around Winchester \$7,000. The biggest single item in the Virginia claims is that allowed the estate of Hannah T. Cromwell, of York county, for \$18,475.

All these claims have been approved by the Court of Claims. Senator Thomas S. Martin, of Virginia has been making a hard fight ever since he has been in the Senate to get favorable action on the claims.

144,000 FREE MEALS FOR THE VETERANS

In commemoration of the bloody battle at Chickamauga 50 years ago, Chattanooga announced the perfection of the plan for entertainment of the United Confederate Veterans and the Sons who will hold their 23rd annual Reunion May 27-29. High officials of the G. A. R. state that Chattanooga's expenditures for entertainment and amusement, etc., will be on a more lavish scale than was ever necessary for their meetings, even surpassing the high water mark at Los Angeles.

It is expected in Chattanooga that upward of 12,000 veterans will be present, all of whom will be tendered free lodging and meals at Camp Alexander P. Stewart. Some follow with a love for statistics has figured that this means the service of 344,000 free meals in the course of four days. The requisite number of Government tents and cots have been loaned by the War Department. The year 1913 will perhaps mark the last pilgrimage of most of the veterans of 1863 to ground made sacred by the heroes of the Blue and Gray on the heights and in the shadow of Lookout Mountain.

INCOME TAX OF PROFESSIONAL MAN

The Circuit Court of Tazewell has handed down an important decision in the case of Wm. H. Werth against the Commonwealth, involving the assessment of the income tax statute of Virginia. The law in this State imposes a tax of 1 per cent on incomes in excess of \$2,000. The statute defines what a taxable "income shall include," and sets but certain specified sources of income which shall be taxed, all of which are a property source except one, and that is salaries. Paragraph 5 contains a sort of dragnet in the following words: "All other gains and profits derived from any source whatever." It was admitted by the Commonwealth that Mr. Werth's income was derived solely from his general practice as a lawyer, that he paid the license tax as such, and that his income was not embraced by the income statute unless by the "dragnet" clause. Mr. Werth contended that the "dragnet" clause was limited by the four preceding paragraphs, and that, since his income was not derived from any sort of property or salaries, it was not embraced by the statute, and, in addition, to make pay an income and license tax would be double taxation. The court finally sustained him from payment. The decision, if upheld by the Supreme Court, where it will be taken, will apply to all lawyers, doctors and others paying license taxes whose income exceeds \$2,000.

WASHINGTON LETTER

The general debate on the tariff bill has ended. Representative Dupre is the first democrat to announce that he will oppose the bill. He will vote against it on account of its free sugar provision.

An important provision of the bill imposes an additional special duty of 15 per cent on all articles which foreign manufacturers sell to importers in this country at a price lower than in the country of production.

According to a decision of the Supreme Court, widows and relatives of bankrupts are entitled to continue life insurance policies in their favor on the lives of bankrupts.

The Secretary of Commerce and labor recently stated that the money value of exports and manufactured products from the United States has increased approximately \$500,000 a day in comparison with last year.

Representative Sisson of Mississippi, in a tariff speech, declared himself in favor of the California anti-alien land law and resented the efforts of Japan to force this country to submit to her demands.

Judge George E. Downey, of Indiana, will be Comptroller of the Treasury to succeed Robert J. Tracewell.

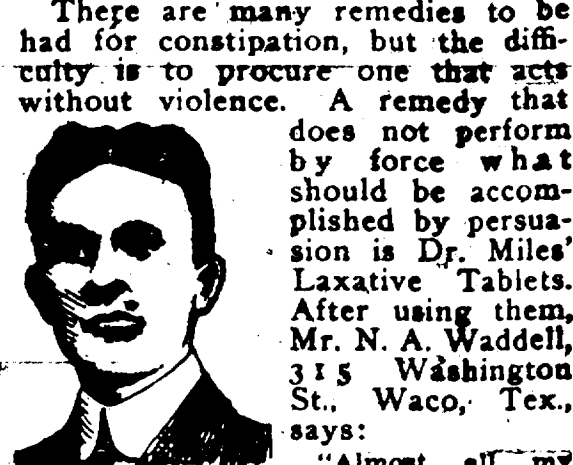
