CALLS FOR WORK OF EXPERT

When the work of the expert has been completed a public exhibition should be held of the drawings and the plans and they should be subject to the criticism of the public at large and discussed in public meetings and in the press.

The commission should then decide upon the plan to be actually undertaken.
