### LEGISLATIVE REVIEW

Last' week the Legislature paused in its crowded hours long enough to fully debate two measures only-in the Senate the game bill, which it passed, and in the House the bank bill, which was defeated. No doubt the same bill, if it should pass the House, would to "swat 'em" do much to protect game in the State; but the dollar tax upon resident hunters is likely to prove unpopular. The bank bill was considered generally good but there were features that were objection able to some, which there was not time enough to eliminate and so the good things had to be dumped out with the supposedly bad Confidentially, it may be stated that a whisper went abroad that the bill was a scheme of the big banks to handicap the little fellows and such an insinuation in the present haste of things could not but prove fatal.

The discovery of some printed bills among the files of the members with annotations evidently ordered to be printed thereon by some lobbyists has raised an awful rumpus. The note to House Bill No. 226 wade thus: "Read this bill carefully. If you do no approve it, wire or write your representative at once." That t House Bill No. 418 was as follows: "Wire or write at once your member of House or Senate to defeat above bill, which, in my opinion is an entering wedge to distrub all treasurers." By some mistake a number of these annotated bills got mixed up with the re- to themselves gular ones intended for the members.

The primary bill was debated two days in the Senate last week and there were signs that some of the Senators who used to be opposed to primary reforms had come around to most of Governor Stuart's recommendations: but there have been rumors of certain emmissaries being sent to Richmond to stiffen up the courage of the reactionary Senators, who are expected to show fight again.

The bill for the establishment of a Legislative Reference Bureau which passed the Senate last week will do much to assist the public half that it has too m to study up-to-date laws of other states and to secure them for Virginia. -Senators Mapp and Garrett, who were the Senate patrons of the measure deserve great credit for its success.

Gorgas—the prince of sanitarians and administrators promptly acted on the discovery, and in a few months rid Havana of a pestilence that had held the town in its grip for centuries. ing the surviving Stegomviæ from gaining access to any case of yellow fever that might crop up or be imported. This discovery and Gorgas's methods have now almost rid the West Indies and tropical America of one of the most deadly of the many diseases which afflict mankind, and, moreover, have made the Panama Canal a practicable undertaking.






