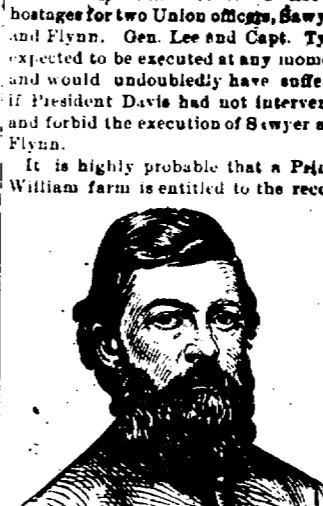

ing Confederate cavalry horns, made him dismount and put me in the saddle. The saddle had no stirrups, and the horse and I had a hard time to get along together. 'Colonel Hager was captured about the same time. We were led to Custer's headquarters where a number of officers were gathered around a big fire drinking hot toddies. They treated me very kindly and, in respect to a horse in my neighborhood for the accommodation of ourselves and other Confederate officers. Refraining in the house I found intimate friends of mine. 'We were placed in an ambulance with other officers among them General Custis Lee. After we had gone a short distance an officer rode up leading a fine horse elegantly outfitted. He asked for General Lee and said that he might go to see his mother, who was very ill. He was unwilling to leave us to our fate, but we persuaded him to accept the offer. It turned out afterwards that the Custis Lee's mother was not ill and that some of his brother officers of West Point had merely adopted the name to make him comfortable and give him an opportunity to get away. I was sent to Fort Warren, and later on discharged. General Hunton was a member of Congress from 1848 to 1851, and United States Senator from Virginia for the unexpired term of 1852-1856. He was appointed to the latter position by Governor McKimsey to fill the unexpired term of the lamented John S. Burkenroth. General Hunton was a member of the House of Representatives during the stormy scenes attending the Tyler-Hays contest. He was member of the special committee that framed the electoral commission bill, and was one of the five representatives of the House on the highest committee that was ever seen. He labored hard to have Tyler elected in the Presidential chair. He fought side by side with Samuel J. Randall to kill the free bill, and
