

The government has made it possible for every woman in the country who

owns a few mulberry trees to keep herself in pin money, provided she is willing to work for it at the rate of six weeks in the year, telegraphs the Washington correspondent of the New York Tribune. Slikworms the world over feed on the leaves of the mulberry, and after an experience of more than two years the Agricultural Department is justified in the belief that America in time will be able to rival the looms of Italy and France. In order to interest the people of the country in this new field of work the depariment will send to any applicant silkworms enough to start business, with full instructions how to make the venture simple work and so easily done that wo profitably, and if conducted intelligently there is no reason why silk culture can not yield as good results as the raising of chickens or bees, with far less trouble For instance, a half-dozen mulberry trees will not the culturist about \$60 a year.
