



General Otis, through his newspaper, for years has engaged in a relentless fight against the International Typographical Union, and when news of the explosion was telegraphed him on his way home from Mexico, he did not wait to make an investiga tion before issuing a statement, but immediately assigned the blame to union labor, or its sympathizers. Subsequent developments are exposing the error of his judgment, and while the public sympathizes with General Otis in his loss there is syr too, for the International Typographical Union, because of the un just accusations made against it. Citizens gladly would subscribe to have dusty streets sprinkled around their property. Water may always be obtained for the sprinkling of streets, even during a long drouth.

Many Towns have banished the dust evil by sprinkling the streets with oil. The method is inexpensive in comparison with the benefits derived, and some of the finest drives in the country are treated in this manner. It would be an effective way of laving the dust in unpaved streets, where it is heavy oiling the road along his property, the expense upon each would be nominal and still a great improvement would be made. The trans fer of oil into the house from the street on one's shoed is the only objection raised to the plan. This is found to be groundless, if the streets are properly sprinkled with the oil. slightly over three cents a gallon and the quantity specified for sprinkling is at the rate of one-quarter to one-third gallon square yard. Dr. Hamner in a recent communication to The DEMOCRAT, suggested that oil be used on the streets of Manassas to get rid of the dust and recommended the following method of application, as having been successfully tested at Clinton. N. J., a community of good roads:

"After application of oil sufficient time should be allowed for to penetrate. 



THE CAMPAIGN

FROM out of the distance comes rumbles of the approaching County campaign, steadily increasing in volume and intensity with its advance. Although the primary will not be held until next June, and the election is a year in the future, it is now time for the people-to deliberate upon candidates whom they would elect to guard their interests in County government. The right exercise of sal Beauty it ignores in worldly strife. the elective franchise is one of the highest duties that a citizen owes to himself and to his community. This means that no mistake should be made in selecting good, clean men for public officemen of highest qualifications and greatest worth, men of integrity, open and above-board in affairs. There now is ample time to make selections that meet requirements of the citizenship of Prince William County seeking the best government. Happily, we are citizens of a republic, owing allegiance to no dynasty, and where the people, not the holders of offices, rule.

Efficiency and probity constitute the vital test that should be applied to the candidate for public trust. They are qualifications that a wise employer requires of his servants, and how much more so this should be true with relation to the people and public sen vants. An appeal of ancestry, a show of transitory comraderie, all the ruses of the campaign type, seeking office exclusively for emolument is nothing short of an insult to the intelligence and the ethics of citizens who regard public service as a secred trust neither a vehicle to carry lavorities, upr a lettery in which the lucky grab the prizes. This is the truth as any right-thinking man will agree.

The election of a man to office should be purely a business proposition, not a seal of popularity nor of any influence that can be brought to beer, either from force of social status or the misguided, though well-meant efforts of his friends. There is no place in the business field for one lacking ability. Then surely s County should not employ an incompetent. What business, pray, is more important than that of a County? But installation of competency insures the highest possible form of administration, in which dependence can be placed. Men of wide business experience should be at the head of each department of County service. The welfare of the County demands that this precaution be taken.

Public offices should not be political spoils. When a clique deliberately plots to maintain a monopoly of public offices to the exclusion of all save those within the organisation, virtually disfranchisizing citizens by promises never meant to be kept, then an example of political gang rule is presented. The offices are apportioned on the slate often for years ahead, and none but fellow conspirators are ever considered by members of a political gang. They do not want other citizens to have any hand in administratration. Members of a political gang do not wish to be servants of the people. They would be rulers.

A repetition of a certain oppression upon a victim helpless and afraid to resent will result in an exposure that will throw a new and even worse sidelight on methods of political gangsters. This is a fair warning.
