A LIVE ONE

THE senior editor and manager is again at the helm and things their last field of promise. around the office of THE DEMOCRAT have resumed a state of normal strenuosity. Aside from Mr. Garrison's wife and children, there is no one more thankful for his recovery than the junior editor and manager, author of this appreciation. At this juncture we wish to inform members of the political gang, who endeavored with almost unbelievable baseness, to make this illness an instrument for our undoing, that we have made a pact, that in the event of the removal of either of us by any circumstance beyond our control, that we are bound to carry this crusade to the end.

This is the tragic end of the hopes of Leopold Selis, "the wily Jew," and his "Jew-wife," as The Journal jeeringly terms them, while helpless, innocent babes are victims. It is a story that would melt any heart, save one of stone. It is the pathos of a shattered ideal.

Alone in their hovel, the cupboard bare while hungry mouths cried for food; the hearth cold with a winter's gale laughing mockingly as they cuddled together for warmth, Leopold Selist his wife and habies saw dread desolation stalk in their path, laying waste

For the husband and father, the protector and provider, was in the toils of the law, with prison bars staring him in the face. And "the law" in this community has been perverted into an instrument of torture from a design of relief.

These simple folk, scions of a persecuted race, sensed through instinct of centuries of ancestral suffering and exile an inheren dread of the law as a destroyer of hope, as a specter of despair.

Jews are a peaceable, law-abiding people, for in their ears is ringing always the cry of "no quarter" from the history of many lands which their weary feet have trod. Their thrift, the les son taught by wretched poverty in dusty roads with hunger for companion, their eagerness to win brotherhood of their fellowmen, has elicted but contumely from those whose hearts are unresponsive to the touch of human sympathy. Let us not forget that they are human—that they are our fellowmen.

Do you wonder that "toars streamed down her cheeks" when they led him away "in the toils of the law with the prison bars staring him in the face?"

Do you not believe that mockery of so sacred a scene is sacreiious? Laying aside any racial prejudice, would you not term it malicious? May not a Jew love his wife and babies? What does The Journal mean by violation of primal principles of humanity—by disregard of the ethics of journalism? The people would like to know. Must all human sympathy be sacrificed to excite the risibilities?

Selis became involved in difficulty with a creditor over a note He had lost his business, had been forced into bankruptcy, and as a result was financially embarrassed. The creditor naturally wished to secure himself against loss, merely good business procedure and not inspired by any desire to persecute the stricken family. As a matter of fact he had been most kind and would have helped the sufferers to food and warmth, as he declared, had he known their

It is not this creditor whom we wish to censure for the extremity of suffering the Selis family endured in Manassas. But it is H. T. Davies, commonwealth's attorney, and The Journal, who are responsible. H. T. Davies, commonwealth's attorney, abused the power of his office, the sanctity of his public trust, by advising the creditor to institute criminal proceedings against Selis in a civil action, setting the criminal machinery of the State into operation against the harassed, frightened Jew by charging him with obtaining money under false pretenses. H. T. Davies, commonwealth's attorney, did this that Selis be forced to affix his signature

to a new note. The story of the trial may be briefly told. Selis appeared in court and with him his "Jew-wife" and their babies. The woman broke down in her appeal for clemency. The creditor was sympathetic. Selis signed the note and action against him was dropped.
