

The Order Issued by the Emaciated Commander and the Way It Was Carried Out-The Rifle Shot That Put an End to the Traitor.

One of the many tragedies of the Greely arctic expedition was the execution of Private Henry, who had been caught time after time stealing food from the scant store of the starving party. Henry alone was strong and active, thanks to the stolen food and could possibly shirk
