INSTITUTE MAKES FOR IMPROVEMENT

BIG MEETING HERE TOMORROW FINDS RUNAWAY COUPLE HERE

Live issues will be discussed at the Farmers Institute which opens tomorrow morning at ten o'clock in Nicol Hall. Mrs. Frank Shaw, a poultry expert from Iowa, will be one of the speakers.

The meeting of the Farmers Institute tomorrow should be attended by all who are interested in the growth of one of the most peculiar and valuable enterprises of Manassas. Officers are to be elected. Since the meetings began in the winter of 1908-1909, a total of eighteen sessions have been held in which many topics have been treated by experts and much information has been disseminated.

At least ten of the dairymen within the scope of its influence have begun a systematic improvement of their cows by testing out the unprofitable animals. Several have purchased pure bred bulls to improve their herds. Spraying is becoming general The planting of fruit has increas ed rapidly, and, best of all, a spirit of hopefulness and intelligent inquiry into the causes of things is noticeable in the community.

For a part of this, the Farmers Institute takes to itself the credit. For a larger gain in the next three years the Institute is ready to lay its plans. To intelligently plan the work of the future requires the best thought of not one or two, but of all the members. If this Institute is anything it is democratic, and so it earnestly desires' the co-operation of all who have thus far aid- Then the father in pursuit ap ed in its development, to unite in planning its future and making it a success.

With conspicuous bravers he fought for the cause his conscience told him was right, to maintain the institutions and traditions of his native land, to protect its firesides from an invading foe. CHALLENGES DEBATE WITH OPPONENTS

CHRIS MEETZE MAKES STATEMENT

Candidate for House of Delegates Declares He is in Field to Stay-Defines His Views of Eligibility.

Declaring that he is in the field to stay, and challenging his Meetze, candidate for the House of Delegates, makes the following announcement:

To every voter and citizen in Prince William County:

As I have already announced myself candidate for the Logislature, and being a stranger to a great many in the County, I thought it only right and proper at this time to place myself before every voter and every citizen in the County, whose interest I would have to look after should I be sent to the Legislature, so that they may be able to judge intelligently for themselves whether or not I am the man for the office-whether or not a lawyer should be sent instead of a farmer.

Now, fellow citizens, my opponents are all three lawyers, with icollege educations. All three are gentlemen and I hope friends of mine, I believe so at any rate. I hold no ill will against any of the three, but they are making the fight against me along the following lines: Chris is a good fellow, but he does not know anything about law. Chris is all right, but he is a farmer and miller and a lawyer should be sent. Chris has not much education and would not know what to do if you sent him there. Chris is a good man, but there is not much pay in the job and he should by all means stay home and not neglect his business.

These, of course, fellow citizens, are arguments, but when held up to the light you will discover that there are holes in them and you can see the other fellow's head sticking through and winking at you for your vote.


