## HIGH TARIFF TWICE REBUKED

SHOULD the Republican party be swept from power on Novem ber 5, because it failed to keep its pledge to revise the tariff down ward, it will not be the first time that the tariff has operated to the detriment of the party's championship of protection.

During the great civil war the tariff soared to the skies. 'The Democrats, as soon as they got a foot-hold in congress, sought to have the enormous tax schedule, especially that portion bearing heavily upon the masses, reduced, without effect until 1880 when the republican party had to take notice of the demand. Promises were made for a downward revision but the bill passed in 1882 only made a very slight reduction and the masses became disgusted-jus as now concerning the Payne-Aldrich bill—and in 1884 elected Grov-

When the republicans came again into power, in 1888, the tariff was boosted from the point to which the Democrats had lowered i came indignant and sought relief by again electing Cleveland to the






