WHAT'S THE ANSWER?

He has announced of the crowd. that he will discontinue the Presidents' New Year reception-a custom of more than 50 years. He has placed his disapproval upon the inauguration ball as well as the manguration reception, both of which have become events of national importance to the social world. Whether his course in this is the best or not only time will tell. Social events of the multi-rich are, of course, of very little direct interest to the common people, but indirectly the social life of the capital is of very great importance to that city's prosperity. Since organized government was first known to history a nation's capital has been the gathering place of all those with ambition to climb socially. The rich maintain residences here simply to be the big events and in turn to entertain lavishly in their own places. Washington is full of beautiful and elaborate homes of this character and the expense of these homes is one of the big factors that makes it a growing city. In fast, Washington without its "outside" residents would be a city of less than one-half its present size and real estate-values would be a small item compared to what they been stricken deaf and dumb.
