THE ARCHBALD CASE

The impeachment, conviction, dismissal from federal office and declaration that he be disqualified forever for any office of honor, trust or profit under the United States Government of Judge Archbald of the Commerce Court, really sets a milestone in our history. There have been eight impeachments of officeholders since our government was organized preceding this one, but only two obtained a conviction, of these Judge Pickering, who was removed in 1804, was insane and Judge Humphreys, who was removed in 1862, joined the Confederacy, so this case stands out as the only real conviction of a federal judge for criminal cause.

Judge Archbald was impeached on thirteen charges by action of the House of Representatives last July. The constitution provides that the lower house shall start such proceeding and that the Senate shall act as a trial court. Altogether conviction was obtained on five counts: on eight counts the vote of the Senate was in his favor. The vote on the first count was 68 to 5 for conviction and unanimous for removal from office. A great deal of discussion of the case has appeared in the papers. Some have brought it into relation with the recall of judges but, as we understand it, advocates of the recall have no idea of giving up the right of impeachment. Some of the papers think such things should come before a court of judges because it takes too much of the Senate's time: also that to hand it to Congress that in this case they have, with promptness and decision, declared themselves on the side of right and -justice and have voted their opinion without fear or favor.
