### LIBERAL-MINDEDNESS

We have written on the subject of Good Roads in these columns a great many times but the subject is inexhaustible and recent downfall events have furnished us with some new ideas that we want to get before our readers.

In this climate we have extremely bad roads for a longer period each year than in any other owing to the constant freezing and thawing of the surface of the ground during all of January and February and parts of December and March. The roads are so nearly impassable for so much of each year that any county, town or magisterial district is warranted in issuing bonds for the purpose of building roads. The increase in taxes will be more than offset ing like the deuce. by the reduced cost of hauling and the increase of values.

This is essential and the failure on the part of the promoters to carry it out has resulted, in nearly every case, in the defeat water and light bonds of the town of Manassas.

In the second place: Where the district has more than one voting precinct the plans should include a good reliable man from 'each precinct as a committeeman. This man's duties should be to insure that precinct's equal participation in the expenditure of the bond money and to see that the best interests of his community it would give them to look down on the rest of us. are properly looked after. In other words, the plans should include a thorough organization for adjusting the jealousies and bickerings of the different neighborhoods involved.

In the third place: It is our opinion that a great deal of money is wasted in trying to make a macadamized road too "fancy " and yet some people say the tariff shouldn't be reduced What we want is to have every mile of our principal thoroughfares made hard and dependable first.
