THE FRIEDMAN CURE

It has been a custom for all time among much of the medical profession to refrain from advertising either their ability or their remedies until it was proven beyond a shadow of doubt that they had something of real value to the world. Dr. Frederick Franz Friedman and his so-called cure for tuberculosis have been given great publicity in advance of his arrival in this country. Part of this was perhaps due to the offer of a New York banker of \$1,000,-000 if a cure could be effected on his son-in-law but enough of it came from other sources that flavored so strongly of advertising that many of the leading physicians of this country showed great skepticism when Dr. Friedman made his first experiments in the Peoples Hospital in New York. The Peoples Hospital is a small institution on the East side whose superintendent is a German-American, Dr. Max Landesman, and has given Dr. Friedman the freedom of the hospital for life. When Dr. Friedman conducted his first experiments there he chose three cases, none of which had passed the first stages of the disease, and in injecting his sea-turtle serum into their anatomy the onlooking physicians said that he used out-of-date apparatus, poor antiseptic measures and was extremely nervous. He has since selected and injected many more subjects and in his subsequent work it is said he has shown plenty of skill and employed more modern methods.
