## **FLOODS**

Nearly every year the country is appalled by the loss of life and property caused by the flooding of the Mississippi river and tributaries. The disasters caused by the three storms that followed practically the same route last month and, according to the Weather Bureau caused the heaviest rainfall covering the largest area in the history of the Bureau, will have serious and long-continued consequences. The property loss is said to approach \$25,000.000 which is enough to make the country stop and think whether these floods can be controlled or not. Engineers think it possible and that it is just as much a national undertaking as the Panama Canal and probably of greater financial importance to the country. They say that one of the most important works would be the controlling or conserving the flood waters at their sources with reservoirs, the water to be subsequently used in making hydraulic electric power and for pursees of irrigation. Then the building and policing of government levees built with revetments that will prevent the caring of mad banks and the forming of sand bars. If there is a practical way of preventing this annual waste of life and property it is certainly up to Congress to look into the matter and take suit able steps for the starting of the work.

### FLOOD CONTROL

Flux control, in the opinion of Senator Burton, is a more vital problem to the American people just now than either the tariff or the currency, and he would like to see Congress take up and pass on methods to meet such situations as have been causing so much a flering and destruction in Ohio before it does anything else.

Senator Burton has been long considered the leading authority an river and harbor improvement in this country. He has gone back to Ohio, where he spent most of his time during the worst part of the recent floods, to make a thorough study of conditions.

Senator Newlands is also making a strong plea for the adoption of means to prevent floods. 




