Besides greatly increasing the free list the new bill provides for on butter from 6 to 3 cents a pound, on eggs from 5 to 2 cents per dozen, on cattle from 27 per cent to 10 per cent, on sheep from 16 to 10 per cent, on fruits from 27 to 15 per cent, on lemons and citrus fruits from 68 to 24 per cent and on poultry from 13 to 6 per cent. Sizing it all up at this distance it looks as if the people who work in factories, offices and cities will reap the greatest benefit. The farmers' share in the benefits seems doubtful, but perhaps it will work out otherwise when put to the test.
