The recently published report of the Carnegie Hero Fund Commission is interesting and unusual reading matter. Nearly all the rewards were made for rescues from drowning and it goes to show that the Commission recognizes no age limit for heroism. One of the most remarkable cases was that of Richard Stokes of Lometa. Texas, aged seventy-four years. He saw a man and two women in the Colorado River, none of them could swim and they were about thirty feet from shore. He immediately swam towards them. When he reached one woman she grasned his collar and continued to the others. The man threw one arm around Stokes' neck and the other woman clung to the man. Thus laden with the three people Stokes swam about fifteen feet diagonally across the current to a ledge where he could stand in water up to his chin and there he held his burden until they could be taken to the shore. The Commission gave him a silver medal and a thousand dollars with it. The other extreme in age was the case of Robert Logan. aged twelve, of Fort Worth. Texas. He saw a boy who could not swim, struggling in fifteen feet of water in the Trinity River.






