In Mr. Stevens' estimate of annual expenses of the electric plant he has an item of \$2,000 for lamps, meters, transformers. etc., and in the waterworks expense \$500 for meters, etc., both of which should be charged to construction. There is no expense attached to meters after they are once installed and his item of sundries, \$250, will cover all the cost of replacing street lamps, lost

tools, etc. These two items we cut out of our estimate. Taking Mr. Stevens' farures on the fixed charges, just as they stand, with one exception, viz., he has allowed \$7,000 for a building, but the council have figured with architects and builders and find that \$4,000 will build a perfectly ample structure for our use. so that will make the description 2 per cent on \$4,000 or \$30 instead of \$140. The matter of income is. of course, purely a matter of speculation, but knowing local conditions as we do we believe Mr. Stevens has both the amount of water and current that will be consumed too high for the nearby years. Hising our figures on the experince of other towns near this size we feel safe in predicting that at the end of nineteen months we will be consuming about 400 Kilowatt hours per day of current and about 50,000 gallons of water. Of course, as our people become accustomed to these things more and more will be used, and when household expenses become adjusted to the annual charge, more water will be used for gardens and lawns, more bathtubs will be installed and more stables and garages fitted with faucets. Also, as the great convenience and safety of electric lights become more apparent, there will be more porch lights, more clothes closets, stables, etc., lighted, but we believe that our estimate for the first year and a half will come nearer to the facts than his, and that ours will miss the mark but We have made some effort to get a line on Mr. Stevens' work at very little, if any.
