Mrs. Emmeline Pankhurst, the English militant suffragette leader, landed on Manhareau Island at 1 o'clock Monday from Ellis Island, where she had been detained since hat Saturday by the immigration authorities. She had been ordered deported as an undesirable alien, but President Wilson and Secretary of Labor Wilson intervened on her appeal from this decision and instructed An--theny Caminetti, commissioner general of immigration, to release her on her own recognizance and without hand. Mrs. Pankhurst now will be able to curry out her contemplated leature tout in this country. She expects to sail for Europa November 28.






