### COLD STORAGE BLAMED

In 1899 eggs sold at 7 cents a dozen, while today they are averaging the country over around 40 cents. The cause of the increase is attributed to the exactions of the cold storage people. The output of eggs is said, by the staticians, to be much more per capita than in 1899, yet prices are very much higher. Millions of dozens of eggs are placed in cold storage in the spring and early summer and are sold during the winter at fancy prices. Storage houses are accused of paying low prices to producers, even during the fall and early winter. The Housewives' Leagues throughout the country are taking up the problem and propose to solve it with a boycott or by selling fresh eggs at prices below those demanded by the egg trust. 

MAKING PIECE OF CONCRETE

Idaho Agricultural Engineer Gives information Regarding Materials That Are Necessary.

Hagineer, Idaho Experiment Station.) Many times it is puzzling to get at mixture; thus, for a 1-2-4 mix the number of sacks of cement will be 40 divided by 7 or 5.7.

To find cubic feet of sand multiply number of sacks of cement by "parts" of sand or 2x5.7 or 11.4. Similarly the number of sacks of gravel will be 4x5.7 or 22.8. If only gravel had been used the method would have been the same. A 1-2 mix would re-


