Returns for the purpose of taxation are required to be mad Collector Lowry's office between January 1 and March 1, 1914. The penalties for failure to do só are severe and are easily collectable under the gonernment's system at the source of incomes.

Although your name may not be on-the list obtained by Collector Lowry from the State Auditor, for safety's sake send a written uest for a tax blank at once.

Jordan at Man As soon as it was made known that the state guaranteed the deposits, money came out from all kinds of hidding places and gold and currancy which had been stored away for years found its way into the banks. Foreigners place great faith in government, and when they felt secure they patronized the banks. It has been the custom of these aliens and many Americans, too, to hide every dollar they could get their hands on. After selling a crop they would pay their debts and place the surplus in hiding places, thus entirely withdrawing it from circulation. The bank insurance law will inspire confidence in banks, and as the government employs a large force of examiners and as the comptroller of the currency has great power there is very little danger of any depositors in national banks losing their money. Howover, all classes have faith in the government, and this confidence will help bring out money now taken out of circulation.—National Weekly.

GOVERNMENT BEING TRANSFORMED

It is simply wonderful how the character of our national govern ment is being rapidly transformed in the interest of the people since Woodrow Wilson became President of the United States last March. The Currency Bill which will be the greatest act that has passed Congress in the last 50 years for emancipating an unthrottling business, will be passed and become a law most likely before Christmas. The scope of the Parcel Post service has been greatly enlarged s that on January 1, 1914, the Post Office Department will carry, packages weighing up to 50 pounds within 300 miles of the point of shipment. Furthermore, it is well known that President Wilson and the Postmaster-General are now seriously thinking of recomemnding to Congress that the telegraph and telephones be taken over by th government, as they have been in England, France and Germany and run in the interest of the people instead of in the interest.



CHRISTMAS ALL YEAR

A spirit of generosity pervades the Yuletide atmosphere. It is known and praticed at no other season of the year as at Christmas It is felt in every city, in every town, in every village, in the entire country.

People are prone to be more thoughtful. Men manifest desires to spread good cheer; women weave little acts of love, kindness and devotion into Christmas good will; children cherish their companions and fortunes. Persons unconsciously instill into each other a desire to distribute happiness everywhere. It ail comes on the wings of that indefinable thing understood by few, but referred to by many as the Christmas spirit. It is invisible, but can be seen; it is not material, but can be felt. It comes every Christmas, but too often leaves to return perhaps next year. when the real holiday spirit ready to repeat the performance. again is felt.

Why does this fellowship of love and good will depart from the souls of so many persons on the wings of time? Why does not the same spirit remain in the atmosphere after men again assume their routine of work and women become normal after their Christmas cares and worries?

Would it not federate Armies. be a good thing for mankind if all stopped to think of others as they do during the Yuletide season, if all endeavored to fill the lives of their friends acquaintances and the less fortunate with good cheer and happiness throughout winter and summer, spring and autumn?

Try this for next year. Make it one of your resolutions, and if one resolves to do all in his power to make others happy throughout the entire twelve months no other resolutions will be necessary to assure one happiness. After all is said and done the only real happiness is derived from making others happy.

A REAL PROHIBITION MEASURE

So long as intoxicating liquors are manufactured, just so long will they be drunk. Local option laws have proven efficacious in nearly every community because the sentiment of the people demand is there was a larger production this year than last in the staples. their enforcement. However, in some places prohibition is not effective because the laws are not enforced by officials, even though the officials are not only paid to enforce the laws, but have taken a solemn oath to do so. In the United States senate and in the house of representatives Senator Morris Shepard of Texas and Representative Richmond P. Hobson of Alabama have introduced a resolution calling for a constitutional amendment which will prevent the manufacture or sale or importation of any intoxicating liquors except for sacramental or scientific purpose. Those who claim they want the sale of liquor abolished, but believe that statewide "prohibition does not prohibit because the stuff is still manufactured," may now prove their faith by supporting the logical plan of putting street between Patrick and Henry streets. The work of placing a stop to the making or importation of the intoxicants. If liquor machinery in the hall will be begun next week, and operations will cannot be manufactured there will soon be none for sale. This is the real way to get at the evil. Meantime there should be no letup to between forty and sixty women and girls. in the local option fights in every state in the Union. - National Weekly.

PRESIDENT SIGNS CURRENCY BILL

At two minutes after 6 o'clock Tuesday evening, President Wil son signed the "Federal Reserve Act" as the currency bill is technically known. Immediately thereafter he delivered a short speech that more clearly outlines his views with respect to constructive legislation of the future than any message he has yet sent to the American people. No stronger word of reassurance that big business properly conducted, or corporations with an honest desire to even approximately operate within the law need have he fear at the hands of the adminstration, could have been asked than i found in this speech. It breathes conciliation throughout.

Enthusiastic applause ran through the ceremony not only as the President affixed his signature but as he delivered an extemporaneous speech characterizing the desire of the Adminstration to take common counsel-with the business men of the country and the latter's efforts to meet the Government's advance as "the constitution of peace."

TRIBUTES BY PRESIDENT WILSON

President Wilson paid tributes to the heads of the two congre sional committees, who worked so hard for the rancy bill, by writing each a letter.

To Representative Glass he wrote: "May I not express my admiration for the way in which you have carried the fight for the corrency bill to the extraordinary successful issue? I hope and beve that the whole country appreciates the work you have done a semething like its real-value, and I rejuce that you have so es "... ished yourself in its confidence."

He wrote to Senator Owen: "Now that the fight has come to a s coessful issue, may I not extend to you my most succere and heartfelt congratulations, and also tell you how sincerely l'admire the way in which you have conducted a very difficult and trying piece of business? The whole country owes you a debt of gratitude and a imiration. It has been a pleasure to be associated with you in at reat a piece of constructive legislation."

HOW KANSAS HAS SAVED

Some time ago The Richmond Virginian published some figures showing the decrease in the consumption of liquor in Kansas since prohibition of the sale of liquor was made effective. The governor and attorney-general of Kansas report some of the good results of the working of the law.

There is only one pauper in every 3,000 population; eighty-seven of the 105 counties have no insane, fifty-four no feeble minded, and ninety-six no inebriates; thirty-eight poor farms have no inmates; more than half the county jails had no inmates when the report was made; in ten years not a jury has been called to try a criminal case in a number of counties,

Kansas, by doing without these luxuries. has saved money. The revenue from liquor licenses has been lost, but in its place has come revenue from other industries in which money was reinvested. Her criminal expenses have been cut down immensely and her revenues not at all. In Kansas they do not believe saloons pay; they have reached that conclusion by experience.


