This same delegate will soon push his bill to prevent the appointment of members of the Legislature on such boards to break up what he calls this species of "interlocking directorates." However, the Senate and not the House will be the focus of all eyes during the best part of this week.

A very pretty ceremony was enacted Saturday in the House of Delegates when silver tokens were presented by the House and Senate to Governor Mann and Lieut-Governor Ellyson. Both of these gentlemen responded with grace and feeling.

As Governor Mann's term expired by constitutional limitation midnight Saturday Governor-elect Stuart was obliged to take the oath of office in advance, and so Virginia temporarily had two Governors one in harness and the other, so to speak, running loose.

GOVERNOR STUART'S INAUGURAL ADDRESS. The inaugural address of Governor Stuart dwelt strongly upon taxation and other matters relating to the fiscal policy of the state, but did not omit to mention progressive legislation which he deemed desirable to bring Virginia into line with her advancing sister

He recommended a constitutional amendment restoring the legislative session of ninety days, and legislation requiring the purity of all elections, including primaries, providing for party registration and expenses paid out of public funds; progressive legislation in the matter of child labor and female labor, and for a woman's compensation act.
