The resolution for woman's suffrage obtained only thirteen votes in the House, but there were many members who voted against it for policy only who approved the principle and were willing to admit that it would be a winning cause before many years.

The House adopted the primary bill as it came from the Senate. not so much because the members did not think it could be improved but hecause it seemed to be the best thing in sight, as it been rumored that some members of the Senate might have willing to let the bill die if it had come back from the House with any amendments, just as they killed the primary bill of 1904.

The House late Saturday night passed two extremely important measures, one permitting juries to inipose a life sentence for murder in the first degree and the other raising the "age of consent' to sixteen years. It was quite evident that some of the members who bad fought the latter bill for two sessions did not realize that it was being voted upon and it is probable that a majority of the members of the House have been surprised to know that the hill




