A the new idea referred to, many churches that always used to have a deficit, have been put on a prosperous financial basis. In one church of about 300 members known to the writer, abou 125 new subscribers were secured by this kind of a campaign, with increases of contributions from about 75 cents, and a total gain in revenue of \$1,500.

It is not often that the churches can teach a lesson in business efficiency to the business man. Yet here is a case in point. Many merchants are conducting their business with a lack of enterprise which is just as marked as the hap hazard way in which church

It goes to show that if you want financial support for any kind of a proposition, you have got to get out and hustle for it. The business man has no force of unpaid workers, which like a body of church adherents can get out from house to house and solicit help. 
