"The statistics of every state show a greater amount of crime and misery attributable to the use of ardent spirits than to any other source," and the supreme court in the same decision declared that "the injury, it is true, first falls upon him (the drinker), in his health, which the habit undermines; in his morals, which it weakens; and in the self-abasement, which it creates. But as it leads to neglect to business and waste of property and general demoralization, it affects those who are immediately connected with and dependent upon him. By the general concurrence of opinion of every civilized and Christian community there are few sources of crime and misery to society

the farmers to vote for the saloons, so that the millionaire brewers and distiliers throughout the country may continue to destroy Virginia boys? ginia, the \$80,000,000 which is now spent for intoxicants, will be spent for food and clothing and the necessaries and luxuries of life. And thus a better market will be furnished for the cattle, sheep, hogs, poultry and other products of the farm. People who waste their money for drink have nothing with which to buy the farmer's products.

For the sake of the country boys living in town, for boys at home, for the quietness, peace and safety of your own neighborhood, for the sales of reduction in taxation, for the securing of a better market for farm products; or all of these reasons, and for others which your own intelligence will suggest, vote for statewide prohibition on September 22 and against the licensed saloon.


