RED CROSS SHOWS INTER-ESTING WAR PICTURES.

Patriotic Offering at Dixie Theater Drew Crowded House-Pictures Were Good .

The war pictures at the Dixie heater Monday night, shown by the Manassas Chapter Red Cross, and secured from the Division of Filins, war department, by Rev. Alford Kelley, pleased a crowded house, as did also the splendid violin and piano music rendered by Prof. Mosher and Prof. Muilberger.

Among the views, which were all very interesting and instructive were flag signaling, anchor chains in operation, warship Wyoming and her happy family, the sailors' study hour, ascertaining the depth, search light towers on ships, submarines in harbors, controling gun fire by electricity. U. S. torpedo boats, showing a number of American types, sports indulged in by the sailors, a number of destroyers sending the torpedo on its lateful mission, the soldiers advancing and skirmishing, cutting barbed wire behind smoke screens, liquid fire, gas, gas masked, facing the enemy, to first line through communicating trenches, and many others.

The contributions amounted to \$24, and as Mr. W. N. Wenrich, proprietor of the Dixie, donated the use of the theater, his services and all that was necessary to show the films, charging only for the electricity and carbon, which amounted to \$1.50, left the net proceeds at \$22.50.


