



WITHESSETH, that in consideration of the natural love and affection which the parties hereto have for each other and the further sum of One Dollar (\$1.00), receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said parties of the first part do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey, with General Warranty of Title, unto the said party of the second part, all that certain tract or parcel of land, together with all the improvements thereon, and all rights, ways and easements appurtaining thereto, lying and being situate in Cedar Rum and the Fayman-Aden Road, Prince William County, Virginia, and more particularly described as follows:

BEGINTING at a stone on the south bank of Cedar Run, corner to the land formerly owned by G. M. 
