Transfer, Budget, and Appropriate \$3,000 in Proffer Funds to the Historical

Commission for the Purchase and Installation of One Historical Marker at the

Maddox Cemetery - Coles Magisterial District

I. Background is as follows:

- A. <u>Historical Marker Program</u> This program has been administered locally by the Historical Commission in coordination with the Virginia Department of Historic Resources and the Virginia Department of Transportation for many years.
- B. <u>Proffer Accepted</u> The following funds were contributed as a proffered obligation associated with the following rezoning case:

Rezoning Case Number/Name: Rezoning #PLN2005-00256, Hope Hill Crossing

Proffer Amount: \$3,000

- C. <u>Relevant Historical Marker</u> The Hawkins Estates (Hope Hill Crossing) proffer provides for a contribution for the purpose of erecting a sign on the existing cemetery site as shown on the Master Zoning Plan. The referenced cemetery is known as the Maddox Cemetery and is located on a 1.6 acre parcel near the intersection of Hope Hill Avenue and Papillon Place. The Historical Commission's approved text for this marker is found in Attachment A.
- D. <u>Public Facilities Proffer Fund</u> As of August 1, 2014, the public facilities proffer account contains approximately \$84,877.

II. <u>Current Situation</u> is as follows:

- A. <u>Proffer Funds</u> The developer has contributed \$3,000 to the County which has been deposited in the County's public facilities proffer account.
- B. Relevance to Historical Commission Activity The Historical Commission is charged with identifying and promoting the history of Prince William County and is requesting to use the proffered funds for the fabrication and installation of the referenced historical marker.
- C. <u>Current Cost of Historic Markers</u> A historical marker generally costs approximately \$3,000 for fabrication and installation.
- D. <u>Board Action Requested</u> Board of County Supervisors' authorization is requested to transfer, budget and appropriate \$3,000 in proffer funds to the Historical Commission for the purchase and installation of one historical marker at the Maddox Cemetery.

III. Issues are as follows:

- A. <u>Service Level/Policy Issues</u> Does the use of these funds further the policies of the Comprehensive Plan?
- B. <u>Fiscal Impact</u> Are these funds available in the County's proffer account?
- C. <u>Legal</u> Is the intended use of the funds in compliance with the proffered conditions?
- D. <u>Timing</u> Is the timing of the allocation important?

IV. <u>Alternatives</u> beginning with the staff recommendation are as follows:

- A. <u>Transfer, Budget, and Appropriate</u> \$3,000 in proffer funds to the Historical Commission for the purchase and installation of one historical marker at the Maddox Cemetery.
 - 1. <u>Service Level/Policy Issue</u> The installation of the marker will further the comprehensive plan strategies to identify and promote the history of Prince William County.
 - 2. <u>Fiscal Impact</u> Funds in the amount of \$3,000 have been deposited in the appropriate account and would be utilized as intended by the applicable proffer statement for the Hope Hill Crossing rezoning approval.

- 3. <u>Legal</u> The intended use of these funds would be in accordance with the language contained within the applicable proffer statement.
- 4. <u>Timing</u> The budget and appropriation of the proffer funds to the Historical Commission will allow the commission to have the historical marker fabricated and installed at the Mattox Cemetery.

B. Take no action

- 1. <u>Service Level/Policy Issues</u> Inability to use available funds for the historical marker will not support the Cultural Resources Chapter of the Comprehensive Plan and the intent of these proffered funds.
- 2. <u>Fiscal Impact</u> The funds would remain in the County's proffer account. This money was proffered/conditioned for the referenced project and cannot be used for other projects. Funds for the marker would need to be provided from another source.
- 3. <u>Legal</u> None identified.
- 4. <u>Timing</u> None identified.
- V. <u>Recommendation</u> is that the Board of County Supervisors accept Alternative A and approve the attached Resolution.

MADDOX CEMETERY

Allison Maddox (ca. 1760-1843), a veteran of the Revolutionary War from Charles County, Maryland, purchased this property in 1810 from James E. Heath. The Maddox family cemetery, situated well inside the tract, is typical for a small farmstead of that period. Inscribed headstones date between 1826 and 1857, with the grave of Maddox's brother-in-law, Jesse Scott, being the earliest. The inscribed tombstone marks Mrs. Ann Maddox's grave. Additional graves are marked with plain field stones. The Maddox family was known to have two or three slaves but their final resting place is uncertain. Robert G. Maddox, son of Allison and Ann, moved to Stafford County after selling this property to George Pitkin in 1859.

10. CREATION OF HOMEOWNERS' ASSOCIATION:

- 10.1 Homeowners Association. A homeowners' or property owners' association (hereinafter "HOA") shall be created and shall be responsible for the maintenance and repair of all common areas located within the residential district, including any conservation areas which may be established in accordance herewith not dedicated to the county or others, for each area subject to their jurisdiction, together with such other responsibilities, duties and powers as are customary for such associations or as may be required for such HOA herein.
- 10.2 HOA Responsibilities. In addition to such other duties and responsibilities as may be assigned, an HOA shall have title to and responsibility for the perpetual maintenance of (i) all common open space areas not otherwise dedicated to public use (ii) the cemetery as shown on the MZP, and (iii) any private street or alleys.

11. CULTURAL RESOURCES

- 11.1. Additional Archaeology Studies. The Applicant shall retain a qualified professional to conduct Phase II, and if warranted by applicable state and federal regulations, a Phase III archaeology survey on the sites identified as 44PW1582 and 44PW1580 in the Phase I Archaeological Survey conducted by Cultural Resource Inc. One copy of the Survey shall be submitted to the Director of Planning for review, comment, and approval as a condition of final subdivision plan approval for the plan on which these sites are located.
- 11.2. **Sign.** Prior to and as a condition of the first subdivision plan approval on the Property, the Applicant shall contribute \$3,000.00 to the Prince William Board of County Supervisors for the purpose of erecting a sign on the existing cemetery site as shown on the MZP.
