

# Number of Positive Tests vs. Tests Conducted - Cumulative




Number of Testing Encounters, Number of Positive Testing Encounters, and Percent Positivity\*\* by Lab Report Date - Prince William, PCR Only


First and second doses do not include 178,425 doses received through the Federal LTCF Program.

- Total 1,609,675 equals 200% (100% of first and 100% of second doses)


## Federal Long-Term Care Facility (LTCF) Program Doses Administered and Received




## Vaccine Received and Administered through Virginia's State COVID-19 Vaccination Program (Does not include Federal LTCF Program)

#### Second Doses





### Second Doses



Second doses are shipped 3 weeks after the first doses for Pfizer and 4 weeks after the first doses for Moderna. Hospitals began to receive second doses the week of 1/4/21. Local health departments began to receive second doses the week of 1/18/21.



# PWHD Vaccine Inventory & Clinics

- **Pfizer** allocation 100% to Novant for school staff clinics.
- As of Saturday, 2/13 – **Moderna:**
  - Total doses received by PWHD: 24,250
  - Total doses administered by PWHD or transferred to partners: -18,720
- **Vaccine Inventory – Week of 2/15:**
  - On-hand as of 2/15: 5,530 (includes first and second doses)
    - Incoming allocation from VDH the week of 2/15: +3,100
    - Allocation assigned to community partners week of 2/15: -2,100
    - Allocation retained by PWHD week of 2/15: 1,000
  - Starting **PWHD Inventory**, week of 2/15: **6,530** (first and second doses)
- **PWHD Clinic Capacity** week of 2/15 (first and second doses): **3,600**
  - 360 VAMS appointments – Beacon Hall – 2/15
  - 1,800 “manual” appointments – Manassas Mall – 2/16 – 2/20
  - 1,440 “manual” appointments – Potomac Middle – 2/16 – 2/19

# Long-Term Planning Assumptions

- Continuing to plan for large PWHD Clinics:
  - **West:** Manassas Mall site opened 2/16 with 12 stations
    - Can add capacity when vaccine supply increases
  - **East:** large free-standing retail site identified; in negotiations
- Continuing partnership with Safeway at Veterans Park
  - Booking from PWHD waitlist only
  - Increased to 5 days a week; starting second doses this week
- CVS Federal Retail Pharmacy Partnership
  - Gainesville location only; priority 65+ residents

- “Manual” booking procedures stable for PWHD despite waitlist migration to Statewide pre-registration system.

# Waitlist and Call Center Updates

- **Waitlist:**

- Closed as of 5:00 PM Friday 2/12 and all data securely transferred to VDH pre-registration system.
  - Transferred 52,995 people from first dose waitlist to Commonwealth's pre-registration system.
    - 2,780 scheduled as of 2/15 (+1,548 last week)
  - 10,576 second doses pre-registered.
    - 938 scheduled as of 2/15 (+515 last week)

- **Call Center:**

- State Center: 877-ASK-VDH-3
- PWHD call center still handling testing questions and scheduling appointments. Currently booking second doses that are due within the next 7 days, then first doses.
