



CRIME RATE COMPARED TO COUNTY POPULATION*











Update on Significant Incidents in May

SHOOTING AT BENTON M.S.



Sunday, May 1, 2022 ~ 10:23 a.m. – Shooting occurred on the outdoor fields of Benton Middle School at 7411 Hoadly Road during a community event (not associated with the school). Three subjects reportedly got into a verbal altercation when the suspect produced a handgun and shot the other two individuals, striking one in the leg and the other in the abdomen.

CLOSED BY ARREST

Adult Male

Charges: two counts of aggravated malicious wounding, possession of a firearm on school grounds, use of a firearm in commission of a felony, and discharge of a firearm on school grounds



SHOOTING – HOMICIDE



Sunday, May 8, 2022 ~ 1:00 a.m. – The 18-year-old victim was brought to the hospital by another individual and subsequently succumbed to gunshot wounds. Officers were able to determine that the shooting had occurred just before 1:00 a.m. on May 8, 2022, in the area of the Somerset Point Apartments and the 14700 block of Deming Drive.



Adult Male Charges: 2nd degree murder, robbery, and use of firearm in commission of a felony

Juvenile Subject (16-year-old) Charges: 2nd degree murder



SHOOTING – HOMICIDE / TWO VICTIMS



Sunday, May 15, 2022 ~ 4:06 p.m. - Officers responded to the Woodbridge Station Apartments located in the 13600 block of Mary's Way in Woodbridge to investigate a report of destruction of property. A resident of an apartment had discovered a bullet hole in his ceiling.


Officers attempted contact at the apartment where the gunshot was believed to have been fired to perform a welfare check on the occupants. After receiving no answer at the door, maintenance responded to the residence and provided entry. Upon preforming the welfare check, officers located two adult men, both unresponsive and suffering from gunshot wounds.

CLOSED BY ARREST

Juvenile Subject (15-year-old) Charges: Two counts of 1st degree murder, use of a firearm in commission of a felony, shooting into an unoccupied dwelling, and possession of a firearm by a person under the age of 18.



SHOOTING – HOMICIDE



Sunday, May 15, 2022 ~ 9:12 p.m. – Prince William County police officers and officers from the Town of Dumfries Police Department responded to the 3600 block of Tavern Way in Triangle to investigate a shooting.


Upon arriving in the area, officers located an adult man lying in the parking lot suffering from an apparent gunshot wound to the upper body. Officers utilized trauma kits to administer first aid until rescue personnel arrived at the location. The man was pronounced dead at the scene. The preliminary investigation into the incident revealed that gunshots were heard in the parking lot before a SUV was seen leaving the area at a high rate of speed.

CLOSED BY ARREST

Adult Male Charges: 2nd degree murder, possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, use of a firearm in commission of felony



SHOOTING – CRITICAL



Tuesday, May 24, 2022 ~ 6:41 p.m. – Officers responded to the 15300 block of Gatehouse Terrace in Woodbridge to investigate a shooting with injuries. Upon arrival, officers located a 9-year-old girl suffering from a gunshot wound and utilized trauma kits to administer first aid until rescue personnel arrived on scene. The victim was flown to an area hospital with lifethreatening injuries where she remains in critical condition.


The investigation revealed that a group of males were walking in the area when one of them fired multiple rounds. Detectives are actively investigating the incident.

CLOSED BY ARREST

Juvenile Subject (15-year-old)

Charges: aggravated malicious wounding, attempted malicious wounding, shooting at an occupied vehicle, use of a firearm in commission of felony, possession of firearm by a juvenile

- Not all systems and services of the criminal justice system functioned during the pandemic


WHAT ARE THE SURFACE-LEVEL ISSUES?

- Petty Arguments and Slights
- Retaliation from Ongoing Disputes
- Domestic Violence
- Availability of Illegal Guns

WHAT ARE THE ROOT CAUSES?

- Untreated Trauma
- Lack of Opportunity/Hope
- Social Influences that Normalize Violence
 - Segment of the juvenile population with little regard for human life committing violent crimes
- Fear for One's Survival
- Increase in people willing to use guns






How WE ARE CONTRIBUTING TO THE ECOSYSTEM
