





The name of this trading post was gradually transformed over ime from Manesseh's to Manassa's and ultimately to its nodern form — Manassas.

The new Shenandoah railroad ine was subsequently founded as the Manassas Gap Railway and the intersection of this line and the Orange and Alexandria Railway became Manassas Gap Junction.

The town, however, resisted the name Manassas until it was officially incorporated in 1873, lest it be confused with the original Manassas Gap in the Blue Ridge Mountians.

The first train station in the city was built in the 1880s, but torn down in 1904 to be replaced by a brick building. This new station was ravaged by fire in 1912 only to be rebuilt two years later using the same foundation.

Also new to the board is Democrat Hilda Barg of the Woodbridge Magisterial District who was elected in November 1987. A retired businesswoman and former fries, Barg also owned and operated a beauty salon for 10 vears.

As for her current occupation as a county supervisor, Barg said it is just as hard as running a business - maybe harder. "A good supervisor is working anywhere from 50 to 60 up to maybe 70 hours a week. If you're really out there trying to represent your district, you're out every night of the

Barg. who said she is the only supervisor born and raised in Prince William County, pointed to the region's massive growth as the most fundamental change the county has undergone in recent decades.

"The population has grown so fast we haven't been able to keep up with public services," Barg said. Transportation and affordable housing needs were the most pressing problems facing Woodbridge and those problems could only be solved "by a tremendous effort on the part of local and state governments and the private sector." she said.

William Becker

William Becker, the only Republican on the board, is a former administrative aide to state Del. Harry Parrish, R-Prince William, Manassas, Manassas Park. A retired U.S. Air Force colonel, Becker is also a former civil servant with the Air Force and currently is serving his first term as the Brentsville Magisterial District supervisor.

Becker said his work as a supervisor boils down to balancing the relationship between growth and taxes and transportation. The question is how to manage the one to the other doesn't get out of line."

Democrat John Jenkins was first appointed to the board to finish the mexpired term of the late James McCoart and was then elected to successive four-year terms in 1963 and 1987 from the Neabsco District.

Director of computer operations for the Fairfax County Public School System, Jenkins is a retired Army lieutenant colonel and has a master's degree in management information systems.

Like other supervisors, Jenkins said he sees transportation needs as the county's most pressing issue, but item number two on his agenda is the need to stem the flow of drugs from nearby Washington.

The council serves as the legislative branch of the Manassas government with the power to make law and policy decisions based upon the authority specifically delegated to it by the state constitution and the Virginia General Assembly.

Council members are elected in staggered, at large elections with three council members up for election every two years. Elections are held in May of even numbered years with the next election scheduled for the spring of 1990.

The current council consists of Vice Mayor John Payne and council members Robert Browne, Maury Gerson, John Grzeika, Beth See Manassas on page 9.

> The citizens of Prince William are also served by elected public officials at the state and federal levels of government.

Democrat Charles Robb and Republican John Warner serve as the state's two U.S. senators. Both senators serve six-year terms with Warner up for re-election in 1990 and Robb in 1994.

Two Republicans serve in the U.S. House of Representatives - 7th District Rep. French Slaughter and 8th District Rep. Stanford Parris. Both are up for re-election every two years with the next election in 1990.

Virginia Gov. Gerald Baliles is currently serving the end of his four-year term as the state's chief executive. Baliles cannot succeed himself in accordance with state law and will be replaced after statewide elections in November.

The governor, who resides in the Governor's Mansion on Capitol Square in Richmond, is assisted by Lt. Gov. Douglas Wilder and Attorney General Mary Sue Terry who are both elected.

At the state level, as at the federal level, the Legislature is composed of two houses: the House of Delegates and the Senate. Delegates serve twoyear terms while senators serve four-year terms. Prince William is served by

The legislature meets yearly and establishes a fiscal budget on a biennial basis. In evennumbered years, the legislature meets for its long sessions of roughly 60 days. At these longer sessions, the state's two-year budget is adopted.

Short sessions in oddnumbered years last approximately 30 days.

Prince William's two state senators are John Chichester. R-Stafford, Prince William of the 28th District and Charles Colgan, D-Prince William, Manassas and Manassas Park of the 29th District.

Members of the legislature have offices in the General Assembly Building, 910 Capitol St., which adjoins the capitol grounds

Local taxes

Besides state sales and income taxes, Prince William County, Manassas and Manassas Park each set a local real estate tax. But while most cities and counties in Northern Virginia raised or lowered their property tax rates for next year, all three local jurisdictions chose to keep the rates at last year's levels.

Residents pay the set tax per \$100 of owned real estate based on a 100 percent assessment of the land's fair market value.

Prince William County held its rate at the FY1989 level of \$1.38 per \$100 value while Manassas retained its \$1.18 tax rate. The real estate tax rate for Manassas Park, which is the highest rate in the area, remained at \$1.45.

Prince William County Manassas and Manassas Park were the only jurisdictions among 11 in Northern Virginia that did not adjust their tax rate one way or the other for Fiscal Year 1990.

Residents also pay a personal property tax in each locality. In the county, the tax is \$3.75 per \$100, in Manassas, \$3.05 per \$100 and in Manassas Park, \$3.50 per \$100

In addition to these taxes, citizens in Prince William County will have the opportunity to decide in the upcoming Nov. election whether to levy a tax of up to 4 percent on sit-down meals at county restaurants. A year ago this July, a 4 percent meal tax went into effect in Manassas.

County agencies play supporting role

In addition to the Board of Supervisors and local emergency and other programs by coorservices, Prince William County also maintains a network of support agencies, boards and personnel at the service of the county government and its residents.

Some of the more important government entities are listed below with a brief description:

• Area Office on Aging - Plans, manages and delivers services for residents who are age 60 or older. The agency also provides general information about services and coordinates long-term care for the elderly. What is a party primary? The Democratic and Republican parties may nominate their candidates by a primary election, or by convention or mass meeting. If either party asks for a primary election for the November election, it will be held the second Tuesday in June. A primary called for the May general election will be held the first

Tuesday in March.

Can anyone vote in a party primary?

Any registered voter may vote in any primary election. However, if a primary is held for both parties in the same election district, the voter must choose in which party primary he or she wishes to vote and only vote in that primary.



• all criminal offenses involving ordinances and laws in the three **Prince William jurisdictions**

• civil claims of less than \$7,000 misdemeanors — state charges

that carry a fine of up to \$1,000 and/ or a penalty of no more than one year in jail, or both • traffic case



The Prince William-Manassas Regional Adult Detention Center, located just behind the Judicial Center, serves as a local jail jointly-funded by Prince William County and Manassas.



system in the event of an emergency or escape from the jail, the detention center administration and the jail board are charged with the responsibility of notifying police and local officials should any emergency arise.

Only once has there been a successful escape from the jail. In 1983, an inmate scaled the outside wall of the second floor courtyard, walked across the roof of the building and jumped safely to the ground. The inmate, however, was later recaptured and steps were taken to prevent any further escape through the courtyard.

In addition to other safety measures in place to prevent escape, an underground tunnel connects the detention center to the Judicial Center allowing inmates to be transfered - without any outside contact - from the jail to the courthourse and vice versa.

Police serve county, both cities

Four distinct law enforcement agencies operate within Prince William including the Prince Wil-liam County Police Department, the Manassas Police Department, the Manassas Park Police Department and the Virginia State

While the Virginia State Police have authority throughout the cities, county and state, the county police and the police departments of Manassas and Manassas Park typically have authority only inside the boundaries of their respective governmental jurisdictions.

All three local police agencies and the state police are operated and funded separately from each other. In case of an emergency, the

county police, the Manassas police and the Manassas Park police can be reached by dialing 911. All the local police departments have a number of community

education and assistance programs. In Manassas and in the county, for example, the police have a Crime Solvers program which offers cash rewards for information leading to an arrest. Information may be given anonymously.

Programs for gifted students are available at all grade levels and for specific areas such as performing arts.



The city of Manassas Public School System provides a complete education system for the over 4,000 students who attend four elementary schools (K-6), one middle school (7-8), and one senior high school (9-12).

A pre-school program is offered at Haydon Elementary School and will be moved to Dean Elementary School when that school opens next

Gifted and talented and special education programs are also offered

Some 24 percent of the city's teachers hold advanced degrees and approximately 80 percent of high school graduates continue their education either in two-year or four-year institutions.

Furthermore, Manassas city schools maintain a pupil to teacher ratio that is is well below prescribed state standards.

Begining teachers in Manassas (those who hold bachelor's degrees and have no experience) earn \$23,020 a year while those with doctorates and several years experience can earn up to \$43,731

All students who live outside nine-tenths-mile radius of the school they attend are eligible for free bus transportation along with handicapped students and those

students who must cross busy thoroughfares or walk in areas where there are no sidewalks.

City officials have been, and continue to work to meet the 5 percent student growth rate yearly through a number of school renovation and construction projects which will be completed next

A five-member school board appointed by the Manassas City Council is charged with the responsibility of providing policy and direction for the city's schools. Currently, the school board

Commuter rail use not yet a certainty

The bills recently introduced would give Conrail immunity from punitive damages if sued over any incident on any train - not just a commuter rail train - on that portion of its tracks used by commuter rail.

Commuter rail would provide service from Fredricksburg and Manassas Airport to Washington's Union Station.

Northern Virginia officials, however, are not taking the passage of the Conrail legislation for granted. The Potomac and Rappahannock Transportation Commission (PRTC) is going ahead with existing plans to seek. intervention by the Interstate Commerce Commission to force Conrail to allow the use of the Potomac River's Long Bridge.

PRTC Manager John Jontig told the Journal Messenger last month that the commission cannot be sure of the legislation's passage. "There are some clouds on the horizon." he said. "Not all senators and not all representatives are in favor of such legislation."

Nonetheless, government officials remain optimistic that commuter rail will finally arrive in Prince William, one way or the other. "It's been one problem after another," said Manassas Vice Mayor James Payne. "We will get it eventually and it's going to be a tremendous relief off the roads."

Payne said he believed, however, that commuter rail was only the first step to solving area transportation woes. "Commuter rail is an intermediate step ... rapid rail is going to be the eventual solution," he said.

VDOT and cities responsible for all road upkeep

All public roads in Prince Wil-liam County are the responsibility of the Virginia Department of Transportation.

Manassas and Manassas Park, however, have public works departments charged with that authority and do not rely on the state.

VDOT handles both the construction and the maintenance of county public roads and transportation systems. Maintenance responsibilities including drainage care, dust control, grass mowing, litter patrol, pavement repair, pest control, signs, signals and snow

removal. There are five maintenance shops stationed in Prince William County: Dale City (494-7575), Dumfries (221-4300), Gainesville (754-7421), Lake Ridge (590-3228), Manassas (361-2151).

The maintenance shops are responsible for road upkeep both local and state - in those county areas and can answer questions about road conditions.

While VDOT is responsible for maintaining county public roads, the Prince William County Public Works Department administers a Comprehensive Roads Program to manage construction and perform some work on state and local revenue sharing road projects.

In addition, public works supervises the installation and maintenance of county street lights and signs. Call public works at 335-6820.

County transportation construction projects, also under authority of VDOT, are often undertaken by private contrac-tors under state regulations and inspection.

Before major highway or transportation projects are initiated in the county, public hearings are usually held to gather community input.

Secondary road projects are developed as a result of incorporation in the six-year plan for road improvements for the county government.

Any individual planning work on the highway right of way must obtain the necessary work permits from VDOT. Permits are required for entrance construction, lot grading, utility installation, holding parades and walkway construction.

Applications for permits should be made through the **Residency Office in Manassas** at 361-2151 or by mail, Box 249 Manassas, 22110.

• Manassas provides maintenance and construction of all public streets and highways, including the curb-ing, gutters and sidewalks through its own Public Works Department. Call 335-8236 or 335-8252.

• Manassas Park's Public Works Department has similar responsibilities in Prince William's smaller city. Contact the office at 335-8840 for local road maintenance and information.

• Vehicle Safety Inspection Every Virginia vehicle must also have a valid safety inspection sticker and must be inspected every 12 months at an official inspection station - usually service stations and repair garages that display a state inspection poster.

Inspection fees are \$7 and do not include repairs to correct vehicle defects.

Drivers can be ticketed for driving a vehicle that has valid Virginia plates but lacks a Virginia safety inspection sticker.

Emissions Inspection

Under state and federal laws. certain vehicles manufactured during the last eight model years, excluding the most recent model year, must pass an emissions inspection before the DMV may issue registration or renewal decals.

New model vehicles have a one-year exemption with a vehicle considered new up to Dec. 31 of the same calendar year as the model year. For example, a 1969 car is considered new up until Dec. 31,

In addition, vehicles more than one year old but less than 21 years old must have an emissions inpection conducted every two years. Diesel powered vehicles and motorcycles are exempt.
