One Time Largest Individual Property Owner in Manassas. Man of Deep Religious Convictions and Wide Charity.

Isaac Palmer Baldwin, one of the early residents of Manassas, died of pneumonia last Monday at Battle Creek, Mich. where he had moved from Manassas about seven years ago...

Mr. Baldwin at one time was the largest individual real estate owner in Manassas. His extensive holdings consisting of the most prominent sites in the commercial and residential districts...

Mr. Baldwin formerly owned the site of the Manassas hotel, scene of the recent great fire. He had also owned the sites now occupied by the C. & O. building, the Masonic temple, the office of Asbury M. E. Church, North, and other valuable property...

SPECIAL SESSION FOR UTILITIES MONDAY

FURTHER ACTION ON PROPOSITION Measure to Amend of Reconnect Taps Charge Before Legislature—Parade for Building Improvement

Further action on the public utilities proposition for water, electric lights and sewers, was deferred by the Town Council last Monday to a special session next Monday night. A measure has been introduced in the Legislature by the Hon. G. J. Meade, Delegate from Prince William county, to amend or re-enact the charter of the Town of Manassas to conform with the State constitution, permitting all qualified electors, whether property owners or not to vote on bond issues for public improvements.

Structural Improvements Planned for Immediate Completion are shown by issuance of building permits. G. M. Larkin is to erect a two-story frame dwelling in the rear of his lot at the corner of West and Church streets at a cost of \$2,000. The building will be 28x42 feet. B. C. Cornwall is to erect a one-story frame building in the rear of his property on Center street.

NEW SCHOOL BUILDING AT GREENWICH A modern new school building is to be erected at Greenwich in the immediate future by the School Board of Brentsville District. The Board last Monday sold the two-story building now in use to Greenwich Council No. 33, Order Fraternal Americans, for \$1,750. Possession will be given at the close of the present school term. After making alterations in the building the Council will use the second floor for a hall. Greenwich Council was instituted July 9, 1910, by Dr. R. E. Wine, assisted by James R. Mansfield of Alexandria. With a charter list of 20, the membership has increased to 12. It is understood that several applications for membership will soon be presented.
