



BOMB EXPLOSION IN LONDON.

Cerhaps Auarchists Thought They Were Attacking Judge Hawkina's House.

London, Nev. 5.—A bomb was exploded at midnight in front of No. 1 filiney street, corner of Park lane, West London. Reginald Brett, son of Lord Esher, lives in the house. The door was shattered and the windows were blown to powder. The windows for a dozen numbers up the street were smashed, plaster was loosened from the ceilings, and the occupants fled, panic-stricken, to the street. Nobody was wounded. The neighborhood is a fashionable one. At No. 5 is the house of Justice Hawkins, who sentenced the Walsell Anarchists, and more recently condemned Francis Polit and Cluseppe Farnaro, alias Emile Carnot. It is surmised that the bomb was set by Anarchists who mistook Brett's house for that of Justice Hawkins.


Big Fire in Indianapolis.—The Less Over \$15,000.




