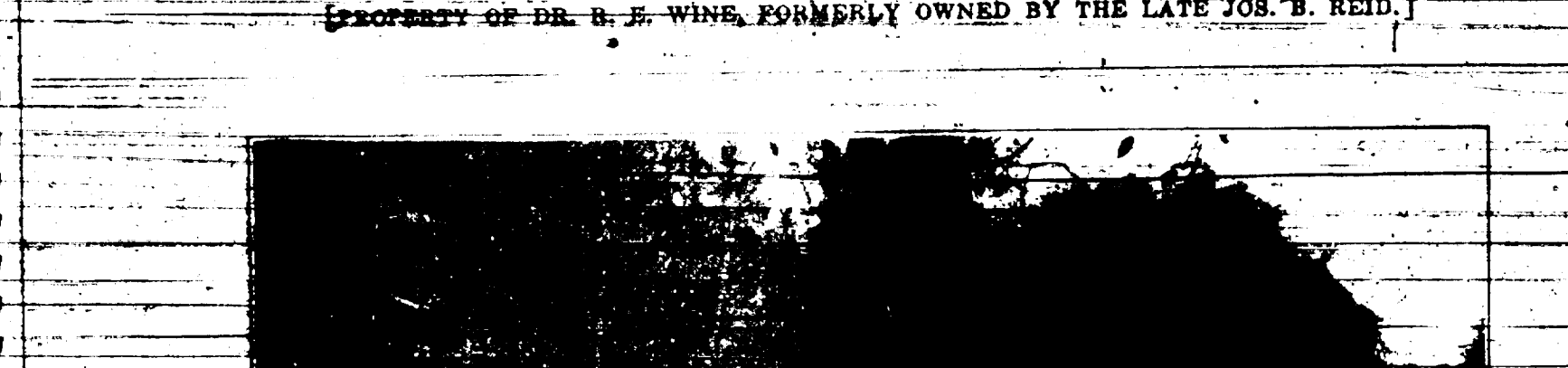

BIG CHICAGO BANK FORCED TO CLOSE

President and Cashier Missing and Shortage May Reach \$1,000,000.

DEPOSITORS OF \$4,000,000

Chicago, Aug. 7.—With a deficit in its accounts of over \$1,000,000 and with the whereabouts of two of its chief officers unknown to the authorities, the Milwaukee Avenue State Bank, one of the largest banking institutions in Chicago, was closed by State Bank Examiner C. C. Jones.

The failure was responsible for the death of one of the depositors and led to the loss of a man's life who was a month ago had placed the entire of his life savings in the institution. In the excitement following the announcement of the failure, J. G. Viseer, an officer of the bank, was shot and killed. He was shot in the chest while on his way to the bank to deposit in the bank funds of that organization, fell dead. Henry Koopke, a grocer, on hearing that the bank had suspended, went to the rear of his store and shot himself. He died a few minutes later.

The bank had deposits amounting to about \$4,000,000, and loans and credits to about the same sum.

The fact that the bank was on the verge of failure was first revealed by the president of the institution, Paul O. Stenaland, in a letter written from St. Paul, Minn., to Theodore, who is vice president of the bank. The letter was received last Saturday, and it stated the investigation which brought about the suspension.

Cashier Henry W. Herring disappeared and a warrant was issued for his arrest on a charge of embezzlement.

The news spread rapidly throughout the city, where the bank had been the most popular depository for funds saved by working people. Soon a clamorous crowd gathered before the doors and demanded information. Anticipating trouble, a score of policemen were sent to the bank. The people were permitted to see past the doors bearing the posted notice and were compelled to keep moving. Many burst into tears when they found that their savings were embezzled. Viseer, to whom the shock of the bank's failure had been the most severe, stepped into a drug store, seeking particulars. He fell dead when assured that the bank had failed.

An examination of the bank's affairs was begun quietly last Saturday after receipt of a letter from President Stenaland. Acting on instructions contained therein, Vice President Theodore Stenaland opened a deposit book and discovered that the bank's funds were in bad shape.

The shortage of between \$750,000 and \$1,000,000 is said to be due to speculation in real estate and in the security market. Members of the clearing house committee were told that most of this amount was unaccounted for. The Stenaland family owned much of the bank stock, and members of the family operated the bank. A statement made showed \$1,051,000 in cash on hand, \$1,000,000 in deposits, and the bank carried deposits of \$4,000,000, and had 22,000 depositors. The concrete New York correspondents are the Mercantile and the Chase National Banks.

MURDER AT VINELAND, N. J.
Nicholas Bert shot and killed by Alexander Cordella in quarrel.
Vineland, N. J., Aug. 6.—Nicholas Bert, aged 30 years, a well-known and popular resident of this city, was shot and instantly killed by Alexander Cordella, a prominent farmer living near this place. Both men had come to a party, Bert accompanied Cordella to the latter's home. Near the house the men quarreled, which resulted in Cordella shooting Bert with a shot which he received in a leg.

Cordella fled and sought refuge in a vineyard where he was found by detectives. He confessed to having shot Bert, but said he got no way to a home. "Give me a knife or a revolver," he pleaded, "and they can kill me at the same time they kill Bert."

Some of Bert's friends tried to take the prisoner from the officers as they were going into the hall. There was a free fight, in which several men were hurt, but the officers succeeded in getting their prisoner into the lock-up.

Want Mechanics For Camp Work.
Chicago, Aug. 5.—The government wants 500 well-mechanically skilled men for the Panama canal. Henry A. Smith, employment agent of the Industrial canal commission, arrived in Chicago to recruit these men. The class of men wanted are mechanics, electricians, carpenters, joiners, plumbers, conductors and brakemen. Mr. Smith will remain in Chicago for three weeks in active applications for men of the most quality. The commission will furnish transportation and passage.

Heat Crased Men Kill Wife.
New York, Aug. 7.—Crazed by the heat, a man killed his wife with a knife and then stabbed himself, which caused the woman's death, he stabbed himself.

Women Sentenced to Hang.
Stockton, Cal., Aug. 6.—Mrs. Mary Jane Smith was sentenced to hang for the murder of her husband, Alvin H. Smith, a miner who was shot and killed by her. The case will be appealed.
