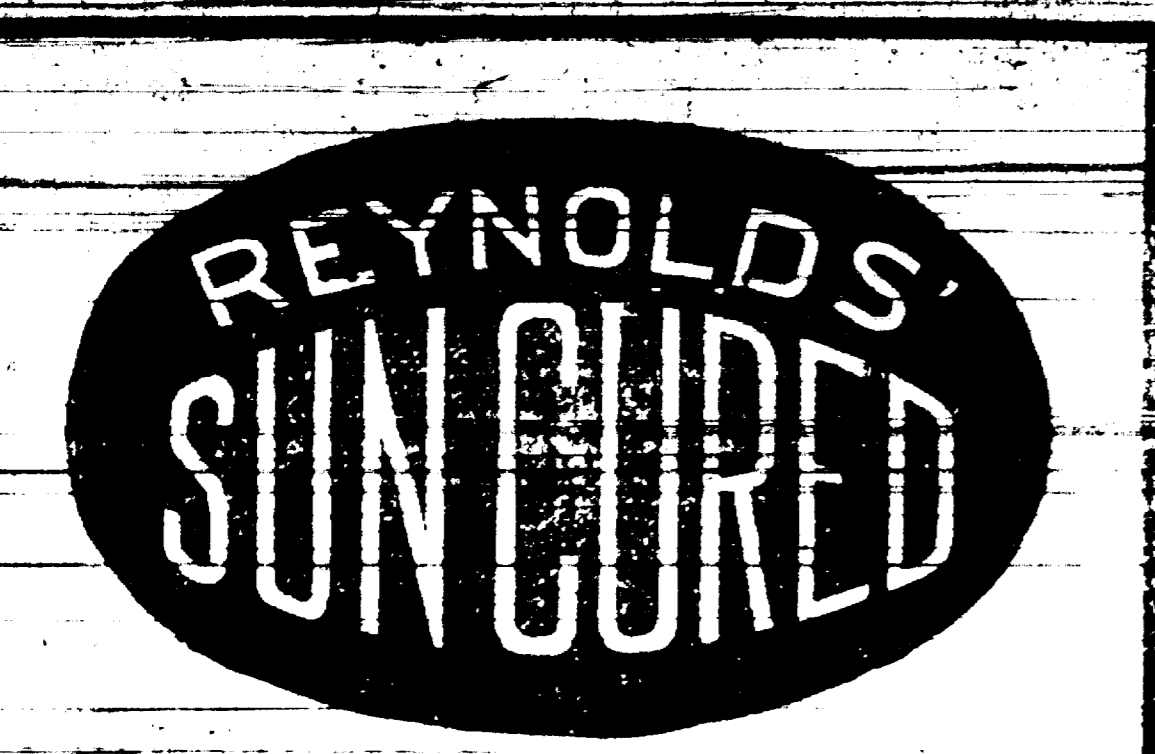

The Mountain Experiment Station has published a bulletin giving valuable information in regard to feeding sheep at that institution that should prove of great value to the sheep raiser.

For feeding weathers and when given with clover hay, wheat and barley give the finest results.

Consider the amount of food required for each pound of gain on lambs was least

Lambs gain faster and more economically than do weathers.

The writer, this lambing cannot be fasted sufficiently in three months to command the best price in the market.

In one experiment in feeding 100 weathers for six weeks only 175 lbs. of feed was required for each pound of gain.

Save Surplus Forage. When the season is past the surplus quantities to be waste during the summer, farmers would be wise to conserve a portion of the surplus in the form of ensilage for their cattle.

The Dangers of Unrestricted Immigration. From the American.

For a quarter of a century, a vast army of alien residents from the very lowest classes of Europe and Asia have been steadily entering our ports to crowd into the large cities where they breed disease, crime and anarchy.

The barbarian hordes who swept down from the North in the fifth century and overtook the Romans, as well as the number of immigrants we have welcomed to our shores since the Civil War.

Prior to 1880 immigration to the United States was almost entirely from the countries of Northern Europe where races of Teutonic origin are found.

But within the last twenty-five years there has been a radical change in the class of foreigners who seek admission to the United States.

The number coming from Northern Europe has gradually diminished while the countries of Southern Europe have sent them in ever-increasing swarms.

The immigrants of to-day are composed of Italians, Russians, Jews, Hungarians, Poles, Syrians and Chinese.

It is impossible for these people to understand our form of government and social institutions, for they come of branches of the human family which have been growing away from our own during countless generations.

In a probationary period of two years or less which the states require for naturalization, they can not eradicate the racial differences and prejudices themselves for self-government.

Yet the majority of these foreigners, through the aid of American vultures, secure illegal naturalization papers in a much shorter time than that required by law, and for a slight compensation, exercise their prerogatives as American citizens according to the dictates of the party boss.

Great numbers of these illegal certificates are sent to Italy every year to be used by less fortunate Italians to enable them to gain admission to the United States.

These illegals, under present laws, they would be denied the privilege of entering.

The restriction claimed by those who oppose restricted immigration that America has no right to shut her doors against these human beings while great tracts of land lie uncultivated in the West.

"Our country," they say, "is largely unpopulated on the west side of the Rocky Mountains. The 'unselfish' principle of such an argument is slightly obscured when one discovers its source, for its comes, not from the native-born who through generations of loyalty have won the right to say who shall enter the land.

It is the selfishness of the steamship companies, which reap millions of dollars a year bringing this mass of homogeneity hither, from the immigration league, composed of foreigners and from the railroad companies which continues to import contract labor in violation of the present labor laws.

At the rate of one million annually the SCUM of Europe is being landed on our shores - the slierate, the diseased, the criminal. They do not seek the Western states where there is a scarcity of population, nor do they adopt our customs and language. They prefer to herd in large cities where disease and crime prevail.

They are filling our hospitals, say Statistics show that the percentage of foreign-born who become convicts, lunatics and paupers is four times that of the native-born.

The majority of the immigrants who come here are of the lowest class of the human family. Since 1894, according to official reports of the United States, the consumption of alcoholic drinks has increased three fold.
