COLONEL FAIRFAX AT COLD HARBOR.

The Story of an Eye-Witness

After General Lee requested Grant at Cold Harbor, near Hanover Junction, on May 23, 1864, General Grant continued his "side" to his left (our right) on his trip to Richmond, via Cold Harbor, where he made his final desperate effort to take Richmond by assault and burning, but he was defeated.

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"All right, General, I will stand at your back until you have been beaten," our boys could not see the use of marching us over the heads of these brave Texas boys; but we went, and in an open field deployed as skirmishers. Leaving myself and my color guard in a group, one of my guards, John Ayres of Hampton, remarked to me: "What are you doing?"

General Robertson said, "Thank you, General." We then continued down the line towards Cold Harbor, and threw up more works until day break, and moved to the house, and the corner of an angle to the right, where, a day or so after, we were exposed to terrible snuffing fire. We halted here, and, as usual, began to throw up new works, for we had seen enough to know the value of them in battle.

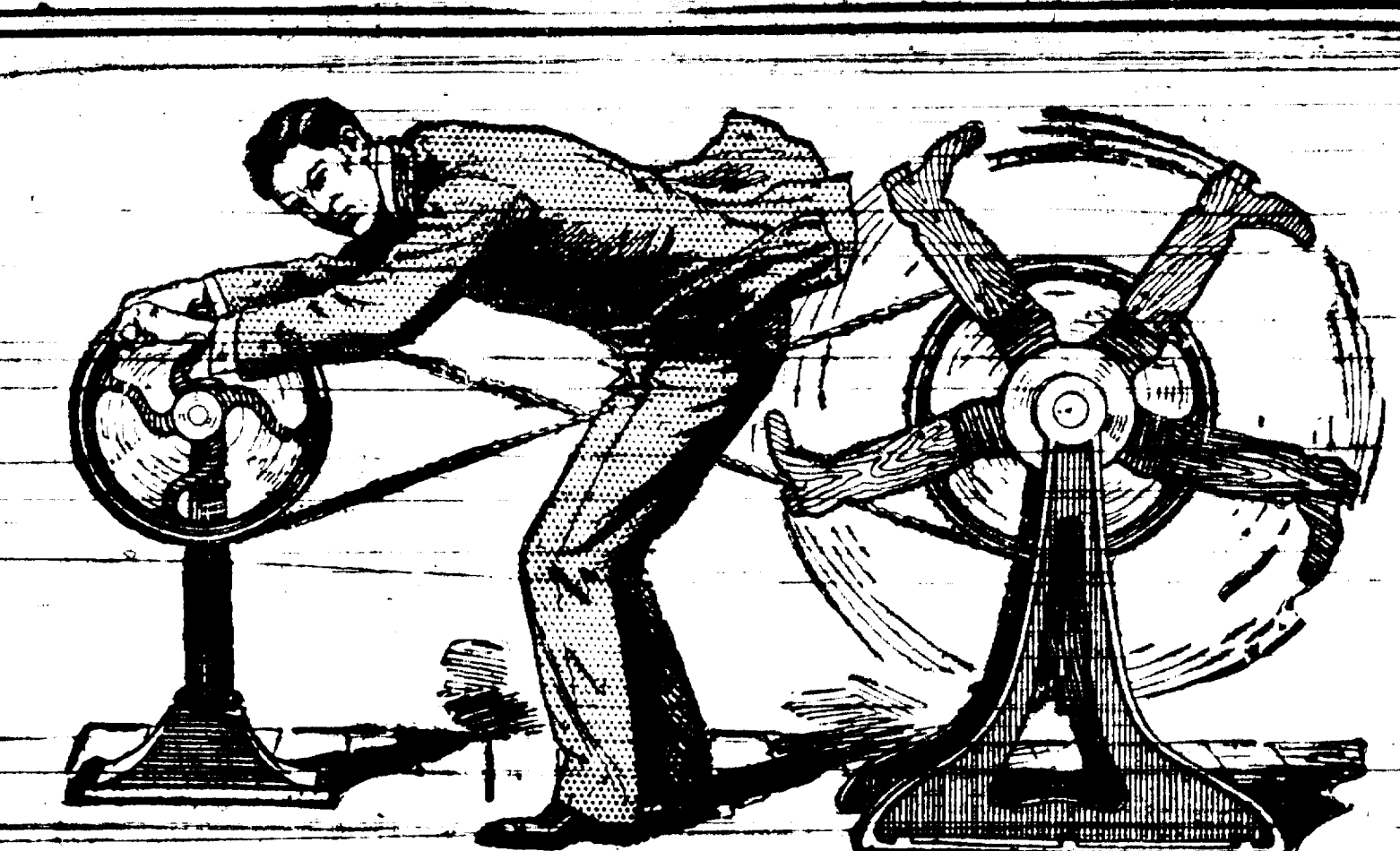
"All this time Col. John W. Fairfax came up at full night, and had with him a pair of artillery, whose battery I don't know, although I tried to find out from Colonel Fairfax for Major Robert Salles, an active artillery officer, who died in Richmond not long ago.

"The hour just in his rear was literally filled with shot, shell and minnie balls. After the snuffing he rode off with a proud smile to tell General Lee that we had touched General Grant up a little. Colonel Fairfax is yet living. He is at Newport News, and is the father of Hon. Henry Fairfax, formerly of the Virginia Senate.
