

MENACE TO AMERICA

WORST CLASSES OF THE OLD WORLD COMING.

1,166,358 Immigrants Last Year.

A special dispatch from Washington Jan. 6, 1907, bears the following: In the fiscal year ended June 30, 1906, Commissioner Clark P. Sargent reports that during that period 1,166,358 immigrants entered and 65,618 non-immigrant aliens entered at United States ports, making the total admissions 1,231,976. The increase over last year's record of 1,059,755 was 106,598. During the fiscal year 1905, 11,450 aliens were rejected and during the last year 12,132. Of the immigrants who intended settling in the United States there were 764,463 males and 336,272 females.

The immigration from Austria-Hungary amounted to 221,132; Italy, including Sicily and Sardinia, 273,120; Russian Empire and Finland, 125,665; China, 1,544; Japan, 13,835 and the West Indies, 13,956. He says the physical and mental quality of the aliens we are now receiving is much below that of those who have come for many years.

The North Atlantic and North Central states, together, received 90 per cent. of the entire immigration of 1906, the South only 4 per cent. Of the immigrants 374,708 stayed in New York state, 198,681 asserted they were going to Pennsylvania, 26,599 to Illinois and 73,863 to Massachusetts.

The evidence is at hand, the report says, to show that some individual or corporation is engaged in importing numbers of Japanese laborers to work on railroads of the Northwest. These Japanese come to Hawaii, destined to "hotels" kept by labor agents, and claim that they are merely seeking labor that may be secured in the islands.

They are admitted to the islands and after remaining a few days or weeks there, they ship for Northwestern mainland ports. Having been admitted at the Hawaiian ports their voyage thence to "contiguous" ports can not be examined on arrival at the mainland ports under the Alien Labor Contract or any other provision of the immigration laws. Japanese immigration direct to San Francisco from Japan dropped during the year to a very small figure. But the immigration from Japan to the mainland ports is reported to have increased from Honolulu and from Canadian ports at the rate of 1,000 to 3,000 a month.

The report says "that several thousand laborers have been imported under this evasion of the law in not number. A large appropriation for better accommodations at Ellis Island are recommended. The Chinese Exclusion law and the many difficulties attending its enforcement are discussed. The commissioner recommends stationing officers in China to investigate and approve certificates issued by the Chinese government to members of the exempt classes, such plan to supersede that of having the investigation made by United States consular officers. Complete detailed registration of all Chinese in the United States is recommended.

The commissioner reports that on the Chinese border Chinese coolies are constantly being smuggled into this country from Mexico. The report shows that it cost the government an average of \$89.94 for deporting each of the 310 Chinamen sent of this country during the year. Other recommendations are designed to prevent the admission of Chinese "white children," and attaching severe penalties for permitting the landing of Chinese seamen.

The commissioner again recommends increasing the penalties on steamship companies for bringing aliens afflicted with dangerous or loathsome diseases and either to enlarge the prohibited classes or to adopt means to compel steamship companies to observe in good faith the law which forbids them to encourage or solicit immigration. The President's suggestion for closing the Mexican border to all aliens except citizens of Mexico is also urged.

During the early part of the year, the report says, the immigration traffic was extensively revised. Many of the girls and women imported for immoral purposes were brought through Mexico and secured a right to citizenship by marrying Chinese born in this country.

NEGRO TROOPS TO PHILIPPINES

The War Department has Ordered Every Regiment. The ninth and tenth cavalry and the twenty-fourth infantry, including all the negro soldiers in the regular army in this country, have been ordered to prepare for service in the Philippines, and will sail at different times between March 15th and June 1st of this year. The only other regiment composed of negroes, the twenty-fourth infantry, is now doing service in the Philippines.

Other troops ordered to the Philippines are the sixth cavalry, the eighth, twenty-sixth, twenty-ninth and thirtieth infantry. The troops which will be relieved by the sending of these new regiments will be the fourth, seventh and eighth cavalry, and the ninth, thirteenth, fifteenth, sixteenth and sixteenth infantry.

It was stated by Major-General Bell, chief of staff, that the negro regiments are being sent to the Philippines because it is their turn to go, and not because of any desire to get them out of the United States at this time. The negro troops are to sail for the Philippines before most of the white organizations, the last of which will not leave this country until early in January, 1908.

A few days ago a statement was issued from the war department in explanation of the orders: "There was a time between 1902 and 1905, when the colored regiments were not sent to the Philippines at all. In 1905, however, this policy was tentatively changed, and the twenty-fourth infantry, a colored regiment, was sent to the Philippines, and there was no other change. The service of the twenty-fourth infantry in the Philippines has been satisfactory and it is thought that the service of the other regiments will be the same."

In reporting upon this subject, General Wood said: "It is a fact that the inspection of the departments of the Visayas and Mindanao and found the twenty-fourth infantry very well liked by the civil authorities in the neighborhood of the various stations. In fact at Tacloban the governor expressed particular appreciation of the fine conduct of this regiment."

Because of this report and experience, the general staff recommended and the department decided it was wise to return to the former policy of equal foreign service for all the regiments of the regular army. The present assignment of the Philippines is merely for an equal distribution of foreign services. They have not been there for four years. It now becomes fair to them and to other regiments that they be assigned to the Philippines in due order."

Foreign service, it should be noted, increases the pay of the men 50 per cent. and counts double time for retirement. It is at the department, therefore, that the idea that these orders were prejudicial to the colored troops or were made on account of the Brownsville affair, was utterly absurd.

The latest bulletin from Liberty, N. Y., is responsible for the conclusion that Congressman Rixey wants to see what the new fence builders are doing and has moved nearer the seat of war. Of the three leading opponents of Mr. Rixey's job two are old bachelors and one a widower, and all three of them are now paying more attention to the men than they are to the women.

It is reported that Hon. Louis Machen has not yet made up his mind whether to be a candidate for re-election to the state senate. It is also reported that there is a gentleman in Manassas willing to help him reach a very definite conclusion.



Leading Lawyer in Meridian.

From Dispatch, Meridian, Miss., Dec. 27, 1906.

There died at his home in the city yesterday afternoon, at 4:30 o'clock surrounded by his family and other relatives, one of the most distinguished and successful lawyers of the South, Captain John W.
