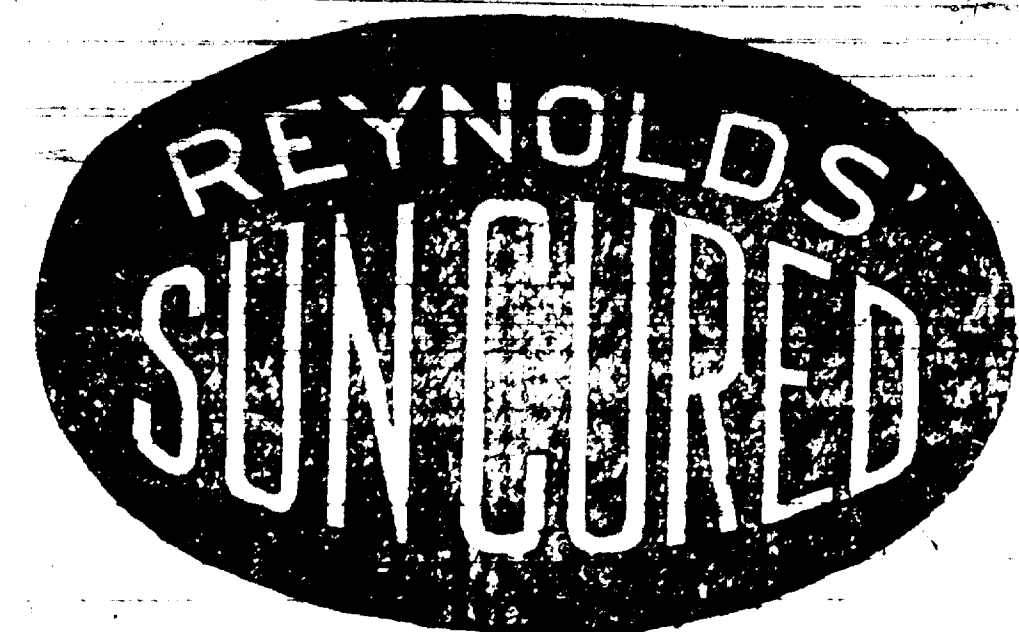

**UNIVERSITY OF VIRGINIA SUMMER SCHOOL.**

Opportunity for Review and Advancement.

The Summer School of the University of Virginia has been re-organized and greatly strengthened. Only highly trained specialists and experts are being employed in the faculty of instructors. By the use of the University laboratories and by other experimental methods, the instruction will be made thoroughly practical.

All the subjects taught in the best High Schools or Academies of the South will be given. The following courses will be offered: English Grammar, Rhetoric and Composition, English Literature, American Literature, Ancient History, Medieval and Modern History, English History, American History and Government, first year Latin, Cicero, Cicero, Vergil, Livy, Sallust, first year French, second year French, French Geography, Physical Geography, Botany, Zoology, Nature Study, Agriculture, Architecture, Perspective, Plane Geometry, School Administration, Methods of Training, Psychology, Logic, Drawing, Manual Training, Vocal Music, two courses in the Medical School, one in Bacteriology, and one in the Anatomy of the Nervous System.

You will observe that the above list is divided about equally between Grammar grade and High School subjects, and some of the courses are of college rank. These courses are to be given by the very best professors obtained. Such men, for instance, as the following have already been employed: Dr. S. C. Mitchell of Richmond College, Va., Professor Kent, Echols Page, LeFevre, Heck and Fitzgugh of the University of Virginia, Prof. Bird of the University of Missouri, Prof. Walter Montgomery of Williams and Mary College, etc.

The Professional Certificates will be issued by the State Board of Examiners of Virginia to those teachers who complete the course in any six of the subjects mentioned above, excepting the Medical Courses.

The University Summer School of Art will be continued under Messrs. Coates and Bredin, Artists of New York City, as before.

The school will begin, just as usual, and continue with daily instruction, except Saturday, for six weeks, to July 31st.

In addition to these advanced courses, the "School for Elementary Teachers," meeting all the requirements for a first grade certificate, will again be conducted by Super. E. C. Glass and his usual strong corps of teachers. This department will run only four weeks, beginning June 19th, at the same time as the University School. But the Training Class conducted by Mrs. M. P. Moffet will continue six weeks, from June 19th to July 31st.
