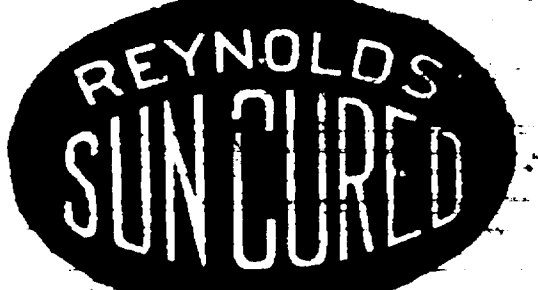

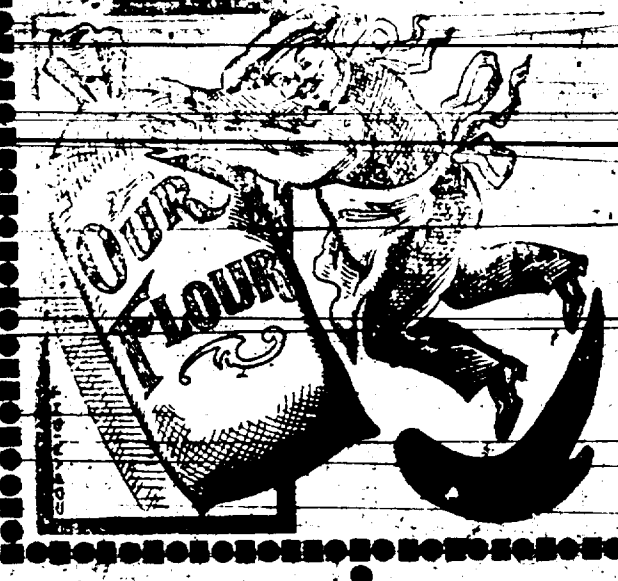

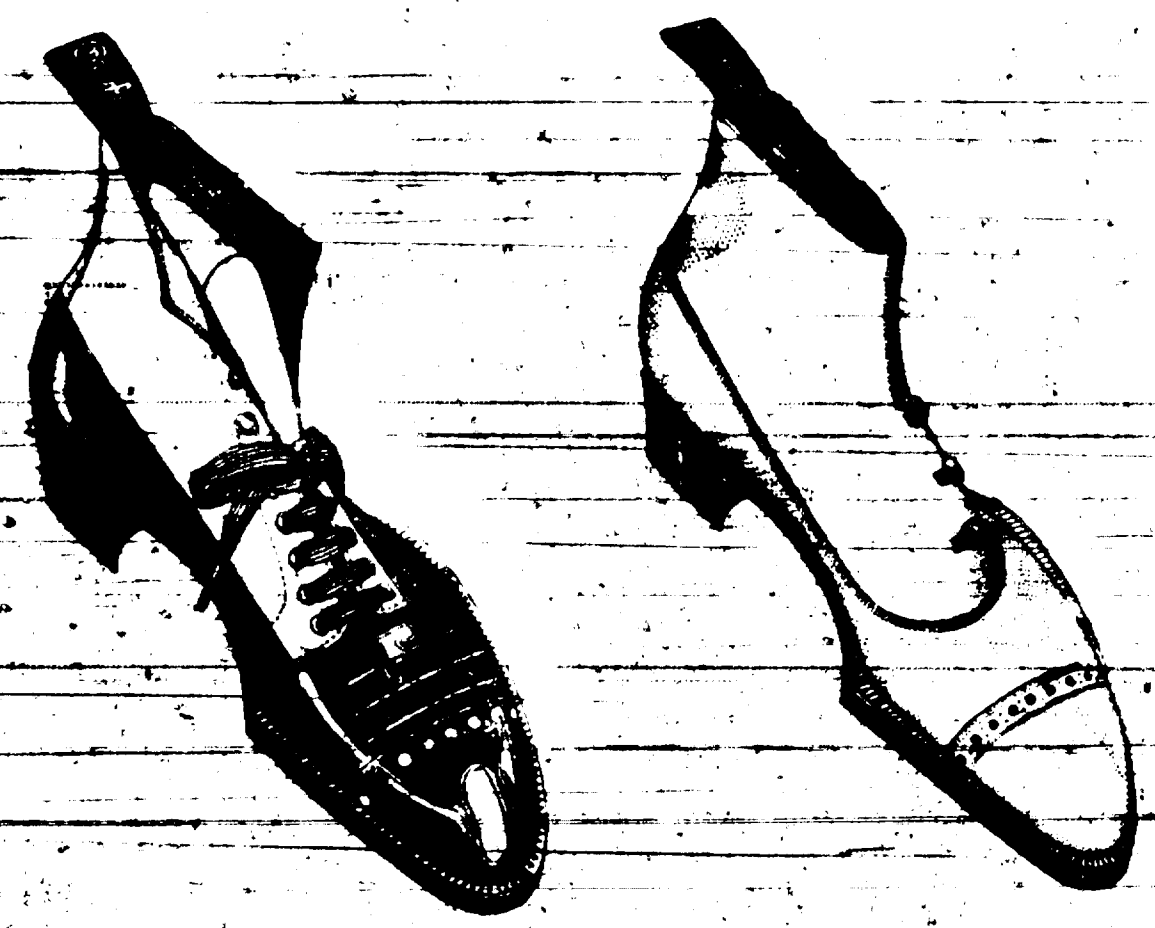

Unlawful for Candidates.

It is well for everybody, including even the candidates themselves, to bear in mind the election law of this state which governs not only general elections but all primary elections as well.

You can no more pay a man for his work in your political interest than you could directly buy his vote. And we believe there are men enough everywhere in this state, who believe in a square deal, to help vindicate the law, should there be any attempt at its violation.

The two sections relating to bribery says: 1. No candidate for congress, or for either house of the general assembly of this state, or any state county, district, or municipal office, shall accept any promise, loan, or become pecuniarily liable in any way for any money or other valuable thing to influence or to induce him, or permit the same to be so used, with his knowledge and consent, by his friends or his advisers in any election, primary or nominating convention, provided, however, that no expenditure made by any candidate or his advisers or friends for the purpose of printing or advertising in any newspaper, or in securing suitable halls for public speaking at a reasonable price, shall be deemed illegal.

2. That no person shall accept, pay, procure, loan, or become pecuniarily liable in any way for any money or other valuable thing in behalf of any candidate for office at any election, primary or nominating convention held in this Commonwealth. Any person or candidate violating any of the provisions of this or the preceding section of this act shall be subject to a fine of not less than one hundred nor more than one thousand dollars, or to imprisonment in jail not less than one nor more than twelve months.

Age and Nationality of Cancer Victims.

Dr. Leonard Keene Hirshberg's interesting article on cancer in the February number of the "Medical Record" contains a mass of facts. Of the age and nationality of victims the article says: "Cancer is a malady of civilization. White men are more prone to it than yellow men, and yellow men more than negroes. It is unknown among the Eskimos and arctic in the East Indies. Here in America it is more prevalent than in Europe, and, unfortunately, its ravages seem to be constantly increasing. In the last fifty years of the nineteenth century the mortality rose from 100 in 100,000 to 200 in 100,000. More accurate statistics and investigation may account for part of this increase, but certainly the increase of cancer is a fact of knowledge. It is truth, that cancer is spreading.

Whether diet and climate have anything to do with it is largely a matter of speculation. Some investigators hold that it is a disease of meat eaters, and yet they must face the fact that the Eskimos, who live on meat entirely, do not have it. Others blame it on fat eating, and still others on bad drinking. W. Nunn, who made a most elaborate investigation of cancer in England, came to the conclusion that the disease and it is decided that the grouping of cases was due to more than mere coincidence. But further study has reached no positive opinion.

"Cancer is almost invariably a disease of the old, and in the United States, in 1900 but two out of each 5,000 cancer victims were less than 51 years of age. The majority were more than 51. Among women the years between 55 and 60 were the most dangerous, and among men those between 60 and 65. In both sexes the disease seems to grow violent at the period of those changes which take place during middle life. From that time on, until 85, and even 100, it is seriously to be reckoned with.

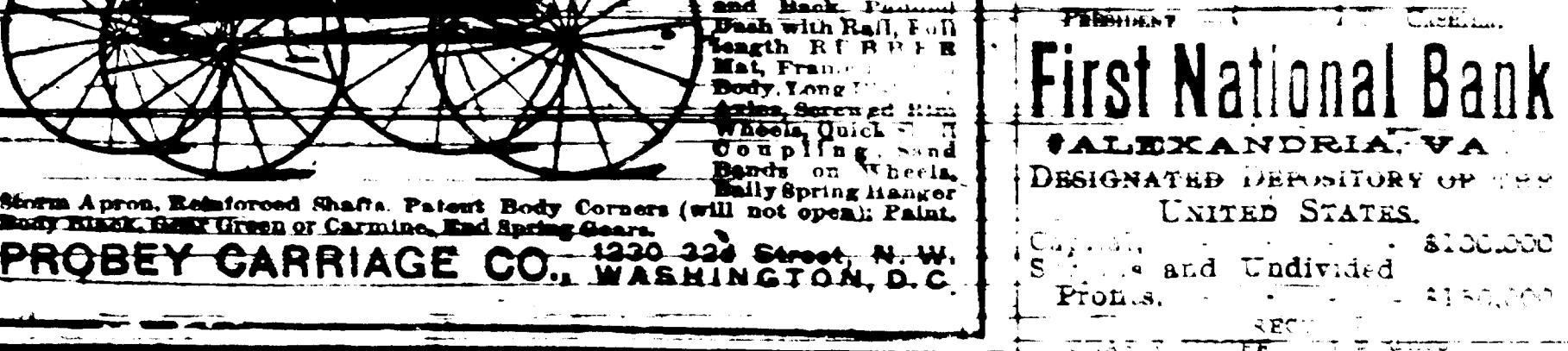
