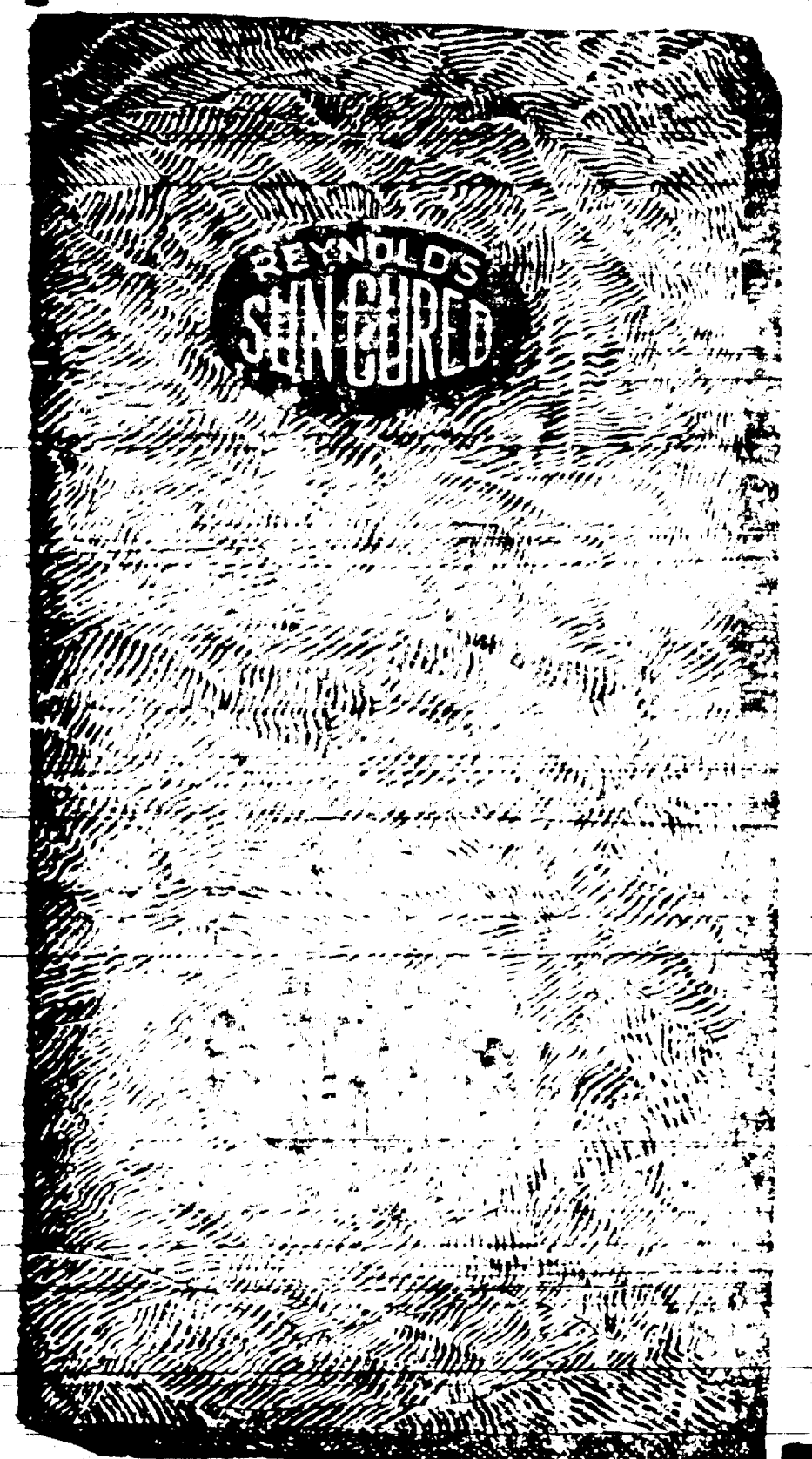

THE YOUNG CHICKS.
 Some Valuable Suggestions as to the best care of the Little Fattens.
 When the chicks are thirty or forty hours old they are carried in warm covered baskets to the brooder, and fifty or sixty are put under each cover, where the temperature is between 90 and 100 degrees. They are fed with corn meal and cracked corn, and water from experience. In humid or hot country the temperature is not allowed to fall below 100 degrees the first week or 90 during the second week. Then it is gradually reduced according to the temperature outside, care being taken not to drive the chicks out by too much heat or to cause them to crowd together under the cover because they are cold. They should fatten out separately when young and a little later with their parents at the edge of the fringes of the cover.

FOUNTAINS AND TROUGHS.
Keep Them Clean or Disease Is Apt to Overtake Your Flock.

Nothing is so dangerous or so apt to be contaminated as the drinking vessel for man or beast, says the Poultryman. In the stream, some sprays of water flowing down the water-way for many yards, a contamination of the water fountain or drinking vessel is of poultry is the most probable cause of the spread of disease. A bird with the "pump" may drink but once from the fountain, and the disease is conveyed to the whole flock. (Copies, pumps and troughs of all kinds are carried from one to another through the infected water.) A fountain which is not supplied in a sanitary way, water kept in an infected vessel is dangerous and destructive. One may always feel absolutely certain that the infection has been removed from a vessel that has been thoroughly washed or heated to almost boiling point upon the stove. Nothing is more certain to remove all danger than this treatment, and a trough cleansing with a brush or broom is more likely to prove successful. Proper rinsing with no lurking danger is about sufficient. Never allow an infected drinking vessel to be used by your poultry. Next to this in point of danger is a sour feed trough that has been generally used by all fowls and left each time thereafter to become sour. Fermentation begins, and the destructive germs growing therein may spread a pestilence of chicken pox, roup, or any other disease that may be prevalent in the neighborhood. This can be easily avoided by thoroughly cleansing the feed trough and turning them upside down each time the poultry has been fed.

A Good Colony House.
The simplest poultry house that will do the work for which it is intended is naturally the best, especially when it is combined with a cheapness. The illustration herewith shows a colony house for a comparatively small flock. The dimensions of the one in the picture which is taken from Reliable Poultry Journal, are as follows: Five by eight feet on the ground, six feet high in front and four feet high at the rear. For a house of these dimensions the cost is not more than \$7.50. Of course it can be made of any size, although these general proportions ought to be preserved, and the height ought to be maintained. Station which is desirable to cover the roof by such a house as this with ordinary tarred felt laid horizontally, beginning at the eaves and ending at the rear ridge. The guttering should be on the side for which the eaves are also covered with the tarred felt, laid perpendicularly with about the same lap, although a pair inch more will do no harm in either place.

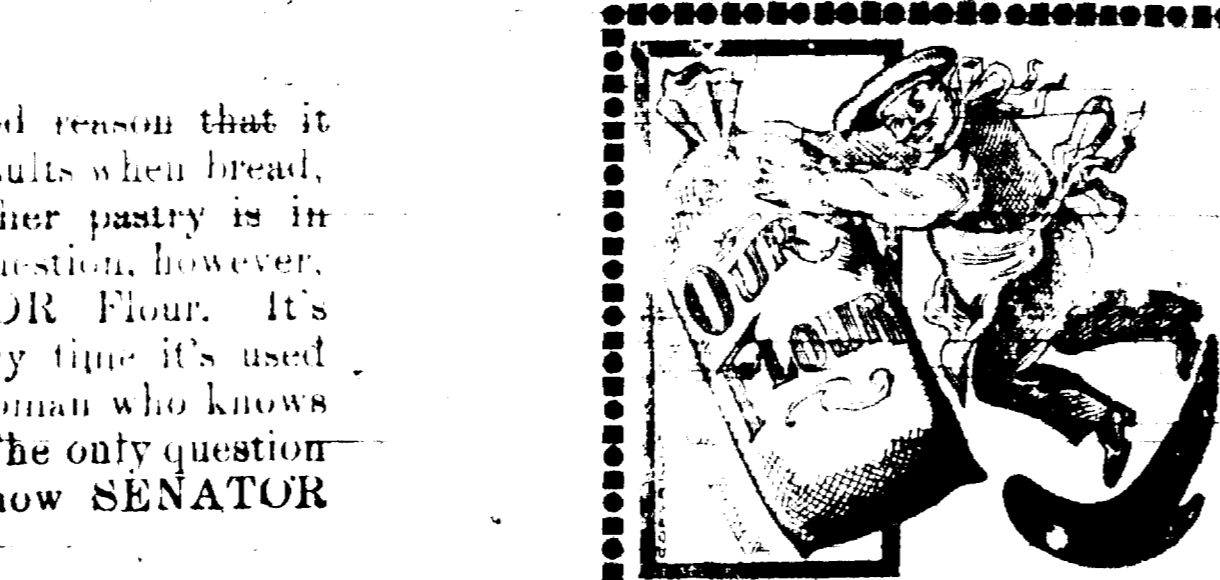
