

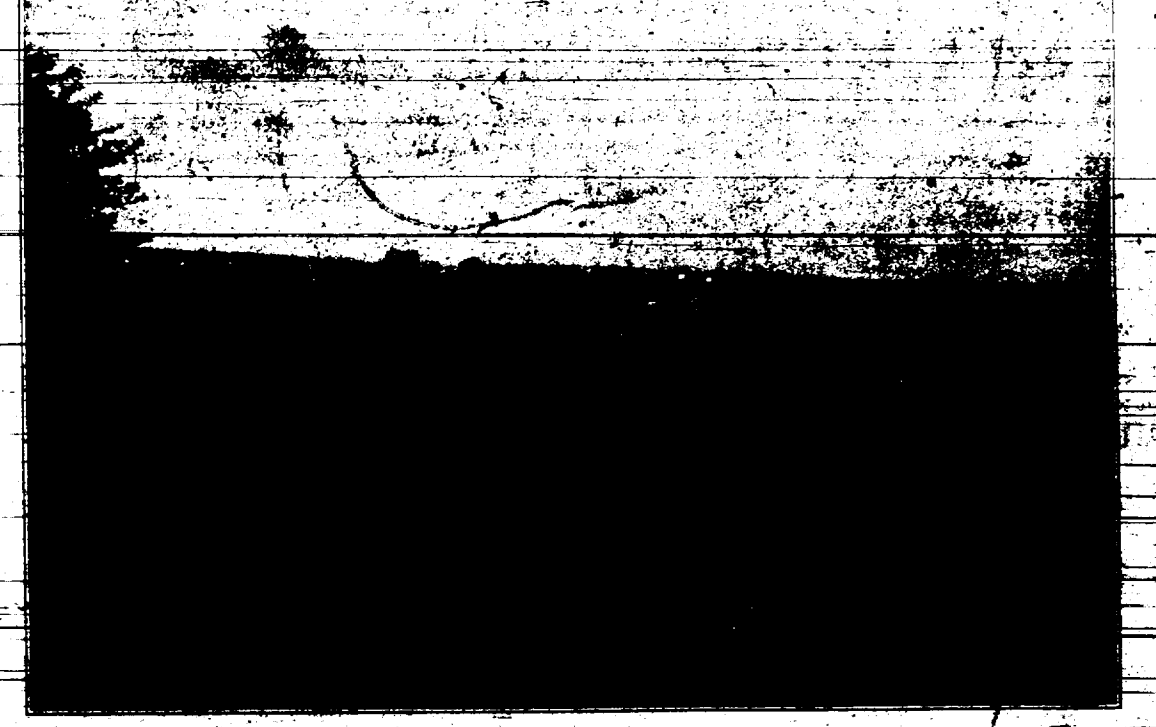

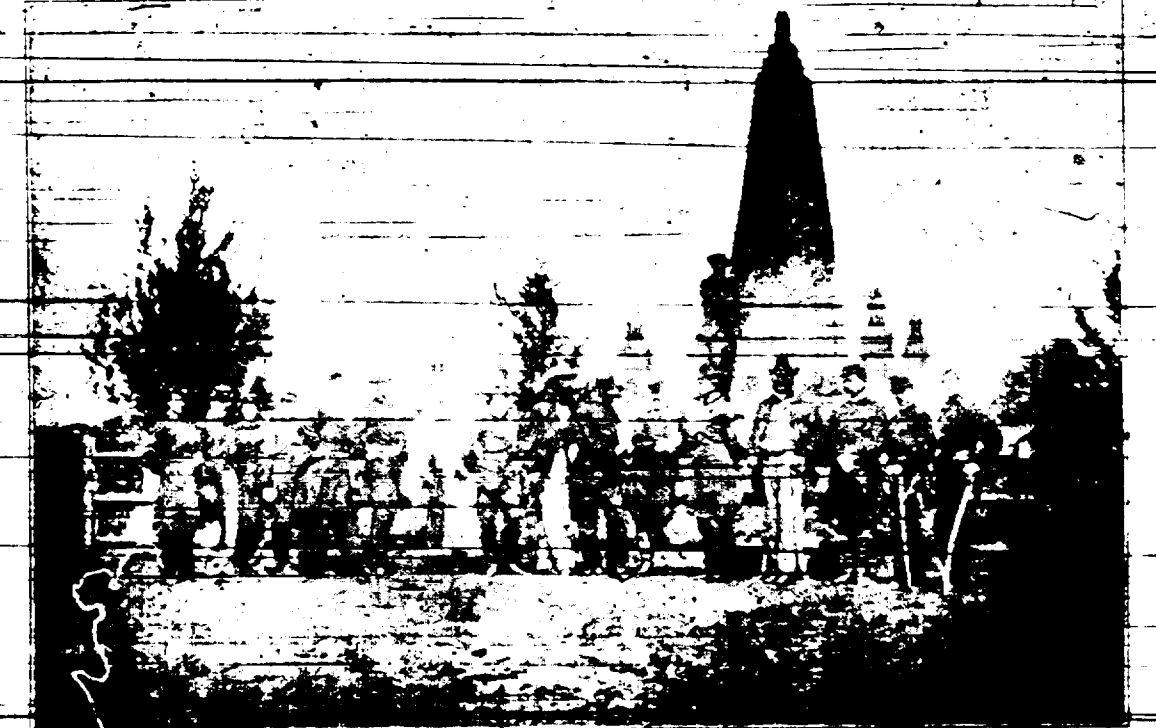

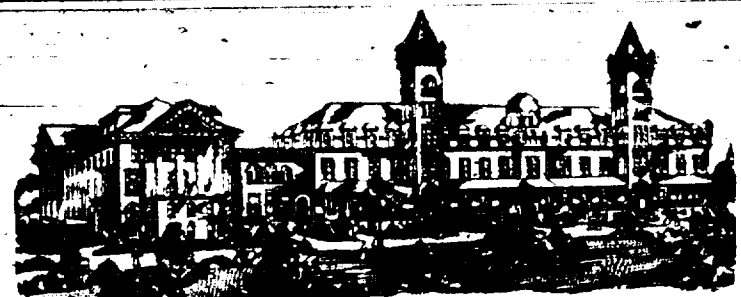

**LIKE A PICNIC EXCURSION**

In Opinion of Fifty Female Inmates Transferred to Occoquan Institution.

Fifty female prisoners, dressed in faded blue frocks, were transferred from the old jail and workhouse in Washington to the District of Columbia's institution at Occoquan, last week.

The change was hailed with delight by the transferred prisoners and compared by them as pleasurable as going on a picnic excursion.

In arranging for this greatly augmented number of inmates to the institution Superintendent Whittaker is planning to carry into effect certain reforms now in operation under his jurisdiction. One of the first will be a change in the uniform formerly obtained with the female prisoners just placed under his care. Whilst the exact style and color of the uniform has not yet been determined it will probably be of white duck cloth with blue ornamentation and will be a decided diversion from the hobbie skirt style.

The females are to be housed in a separate building, having accommodations for 125 prisoners and will be, as they properly should, entirely under the care and supervision of officials and guards of their own sex. A separate building, also, will be provided for these officers and guards.

The work to be allotted to the female prisoners is to consist of making clothing for both the male and female prisoners, laundry work and looking after the flower gardens and walks surrounding the institution. Opportunities for proper recreation will be afforded the female inmates and every detail for their reasonable accommodation will be made.

**AN ASSERTION EASILY DISPROVED.**

A depleted treasury, through the administration of former Governor Swanson, is the hobby upon which Mr. Glass seeks to ride into the United States senate. This howl has been kept up by him despite the fact that the records in the treasurer's office clearly show that Governor Swanson, when he retired as the states chief executive, left a surplus in the treasury of \$787,449.10 and that during his administration had expended in the purchase of state bonds, before they were due, the sum of \$549,854.47, increasing the surplus in cash and bonds accumulated during his administration to the sum of \$1,337,303.67, a surplus greater by \$442,701.84, than when he assumed the office of Governor.

These are facts and figures that are beyond a successful contradiction.

On the 19th of June, of this year, there was in the treasury \$613,146.82 in the face of the great hue and cry raised by Mr. Glass that the state is bankrupt due to the finwise administration of Mr. Swanson.

The auditor has recently given his check for \$420,000 to pay the interest on the public debt which includes all interest due by the state. After paying this interest the state will have an ample balance in the treasury to meet all its demands.

The flourishing condition of the state's finances and her ample resources to meet all obligations as they become due, without any increase in taxation, is a sufficient guarantee against the unwarranted claim of Mr. Glass for selfish ends.

The democratic party, in the last gubernatorial election, successfully met similar assaults then made by Mr. Kent and it will surely rebuke, at the approaching September primary, the attacks of Mr. Glass and his supporters, while Senator Swanson is exercising that same vigilant care for Virginia's interests in the United States Senate as he exercised when he served four years as her chief executive.

**GENERAL EVANS DEAD.**

General Clement Evans, that grand old friend of Lee, Jackson and Stuart, and formerly commander-in-chief of the United Daughters of the Confederacy, is dead.

The recollections of deeds typical of the devotion to the Southern cause and which laid the foundation of an organization whose chief object is to keep alive memories of the heroic confederate dead and of the cause which they espoused, come with vivid force to the minds of old time Southerners.

The U. D. C., under the leadership of General Evans, accomplished honors which will live in the hearts of members of that organization for ages to come.

The end of this grand old leader came peacefully at the age of 79 years in his home in At-

lantie, Ga. Sunday afternoon, and as the angel of death severed the silvery cord which released his spirit from its tenement of clay, the south lost one of her most devoted citizens and the country the loss of a life well honored and faithful friend.

**Compende Spirit of Reunion Jubilee.**

The last number of Leslie's Magazine has the following to say with regard to the approaching re-union of the Blue and the Gray:

"The second gathering of the Blue and the Gray will occur on the battle field of Bull Run on its fiftieth anniversary, July 21st. It will be a love feast, and several thousands of the men who wore the Blue and those who wore the Gray are expected to be there. It is to be presumed that both sides will enter into the spirit of the day with enthusiasm.

"The few surviving officers of high rank in that battle, Unionist and Confederate, are to participate in the celebration, according to the plans. President Taft is to make an address there.

"Bull Run was a Union defeat, but neither defeat nor victory will be celebrated there this year. It will be a great peace observance, to which the belligerents of half a century ago will come as brothers. The dominant note at the observances will be that of reconciliation, fraternity, genuine Americanism. It was the greatest Civil War in history, but, unlike other civil conflicts, it has left no scars. In the West Point and Annapolis academies for the past forty years have been sons and grandsons of the wearers of the Gray as well as of the Blue. In the ranks of the army and the navy of to-day, and of every other year since 1863, South as well as North has been represented."

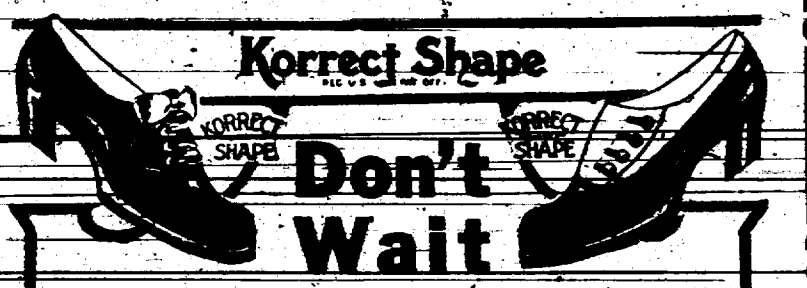
