A PLEA FOR THE HORSES
GREAT INSTITUTE MEETING
Pupils of Bradley are Given Prizes for Essays on Second School of the State.

Professor Button Offers Advice to Farmers as to Care of Horses During Spring Rush.
Wind and Weather Fail to Dampen Ardor of Prince William Farmers.
At the Bradley School celebration, held February 22nd last, Mr. Round offered a prize of \$1.00 to that pupil who would write the best history of the school.
The Woman's Auxiliary meeting in connection with the Farmers' Institute on Friday last, was notwithstanding the extremely unfavorable and disagreeable weather, largely attended and was marked by addresses of more than usual interest.
One of the results of the late spring will be that many farmers, fearing that they are already too late to secure a good crop, will overwork their horses before they are in the best condition to stand the strain and weaken them for the entire season.
Corn is, of course, the basis of the ration. Some horses bolt their food and should be grinded. Other horses grind their corn well and like corn unground. In general, young horses grind corn better than old horses, but not always. It is unsafe to feed horses corn on the cob as the proportion of corn to cob and chaff is not always in the ratio that we are sure to give the horse more at one time than at another. Bright sweet hay is almost a necessity, but it can be obtained shredded corn fodder is better than straw. Give fully half of the hay at night, the other half at the morning quarter at noon. Corn and hay are not, however, a perfect ration. Not enough protein is present to keep up the waste of the muscles, blood, nerves and glands. If the hay is mostly clover it helps, but it is not a healthy one. Alfalfa is fine but locally out of the question. Wheat bran is perhaps the best thing on the market to supplement a corn and hay ration. Many farmers are misled by the idea that a food like bran is stronger than bran, because it weighs more to the quart and when an animal is weak they add corn to the ration when the real need is for something like bran which can renew the worn out blood, muscles and nerves. Horses can stand more hard work when fed a properly balanced ration than when fed one rich in starch and fat. Another need is to know the weight of a horse and feed in proportion. Big horses often suffer by comparison with smaller ones because they are fed alike. A 1,400 pound horse needs fully a third more food than one which weighs 1,000 pounds. Then two horses vary in appetite and the wise farmer will take this into account instead of leaving it to the care of a poor ignorant hand whose one aim is "pork and sundown." A daily ration which has given good results on many farms on horses averaging 1,000 pounds is as follows:
Hay, 12 pounds; corn, 2 gallons; about 11 pounds of bran and 2 1/2 pounds. As some bran is much bulkier than other lots it should be weighed out once or twice to get the right bulk. A handful of oil meal or better yet whole flaxseed twice a week has a wonderfully good effect on the digestion of the hay and the rest of the bran should be fed at night, giving the corn morning and noon when the horse must eat quickly. Water should be given at least five times during hot, sweaty, spring days and a teaspoonful of salt once a day.

ADDENDA BY MR. ROUND, COMPILED FROM THE SCHOOL RECORDS.

At the township election of May, 1871, the voters by 100 to 63 decided on a district levy of 40 cents on \$100 for the purpose of building school houses. It is exceedingly doubtful whether there was a larger district tax ever collected before or since that time within the limits of the commonwealth.

There was a Bradley school house built before the war, by private subscription on the Good farm, about halfway between Manassas and the present site of the Bradley public school house.

schools, having removed to Virginia from Canada. The Buckhall school house was raised November 8, 1871, and the Bradley house on the next day and both buildings were completed and paid for on January 1, 1872.

It was destroyed during the war and our board collected a claim from the United States, which brought \$225 into our district treasury. On October 7, 1871, our board voted to employ Miss Julia T. Clark to teach the Bradley school for 24 months in a log house a few rods from the Limstrong corner on the road toward Bland's Ford.

The prize offered by me was for the purpose of impressing on the minds of the rising generation the interesting historic fact that these two school houses were the first to be built under the public school law of 1870.

THE QUESTION OF BONDING THE DISTRICTS OF THE COUNTY TO CONSTRUCT THE QUEBEC-MIAMI HIGHWAY appears to be paramount. It was very fortunate that the General Assembly, during its closing hours, passed a bill which provided for the voting upon bond issues solely in districts affected by the result.

FIX THE CROSSINGS. While we realize the fact that our Town Council is doing almost all within its means for the comfort and convenience of our citizens, still our street crossings need improvement, and this should be done, even at a sacrifice of other improvements.

QUEBEC-MIAMI HIGHWAY. The town of Manassas wants the Quebec-Miami highway and she is willing to pay her proportion of the cost of construction. It is a fact that this town will have to bear one-third of the burden, the taxable values being relatively speaking - Manassas, \$624,935.50, the district \$1,687,768.

THE TOWN, THEREFORE, IS ASKING nothing unreasonable or unreasonable of the district when it proposes a bond issue for the highway, because this transcontinental road, extending from the extreme North to the Gulf stream will be of far greater value than would be a railway, and the land values in the districts through which the road will pass will be far more advanced than will be the increased price of real estate in Manassas.

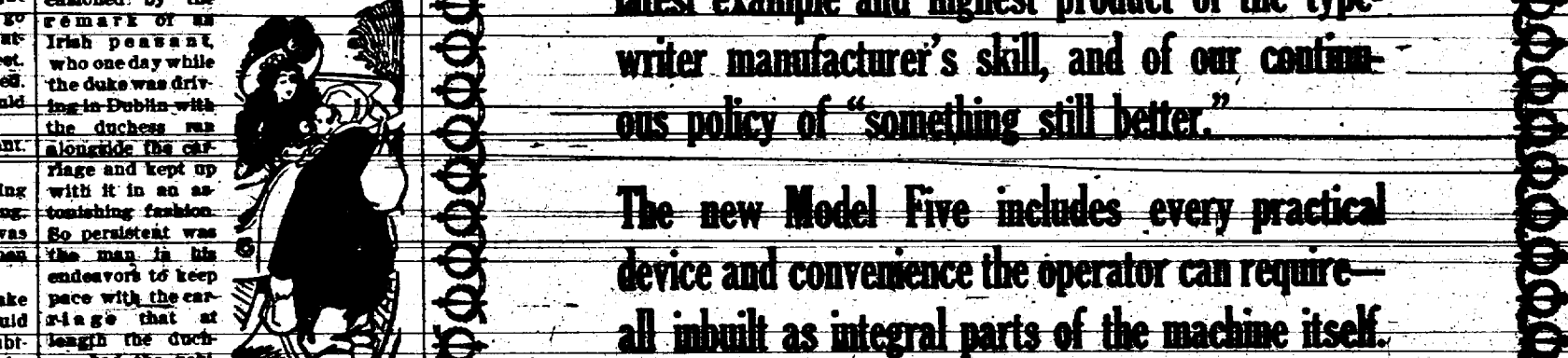

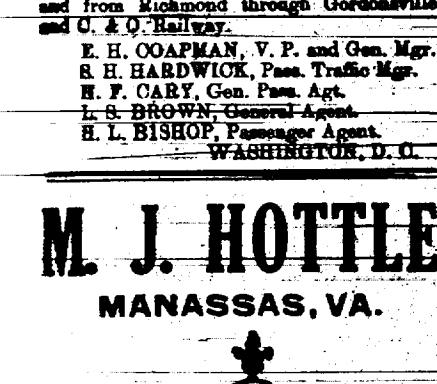

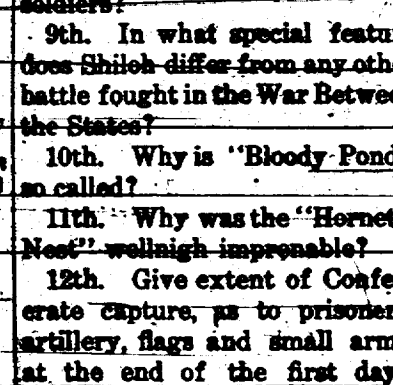
