SCHOOL LAWS

The great and constant growth at our public school brings to mind the fact that a good many clauses in our school laws are obsolete and perfectly inefficient to make the schools the great factor for advancement that they are in other states. A committee of broad-minded educated experienced men should be sufferized to go over the school laws and reorganize them from start to finish. While our schools have made rapid strides ahead in the past few years they are beginning to bump up against some of the things that will have to be changed before they can go much further.

The University should be an integral part of one school system and like it co-educational. Another thing: As it is now, one member of the county board of supervisors really controls the entire policy of the local school. Any individual, corporation or public service is at the mercy of its income; that decides what its policy, line of work and advancement shall be and that is what the supervisor dictates Recording of what the require ments may be, or what ability to judge of them he may possess, it is within his power to dictate. This is altogether wrong. The school board should have the power to make estimates of what their work for the year will cost and have the taxes adjusted to meet these expenses. The members of the school board, not the supervisors, are in a position to judge and have the ability, or should recary of Fashions. have, to fix a tax that would be proportionate to the needs of the schools and the resources of the school patrons. Again; Some reto quirements should be fixed as to the school training that school officers should have. Fitness for office should be of more importance than good-fellowship or political preferment.


