# FIFTH NATIONAL CORN EXPOSITION

The Virginia State Corn Show, to be held at Blacksburg, January 2 and 3, has been designated as the official clearing house for competitive exhibits from Virginia to the Fifth National Corn Exposition to be held at Columbia, S. C., January 27 to February 8.
